Ready, set, grow!

Gardeners, get started on your growing season by checking out seeds from the Seed Library. Saving seeds gives you a chance to know exactly what type and variety of plants you'll be growing and offers you the chance to share those seeds with other gardeners.

How to use the Seed Library:

Select the type of seed you want. You can check out a maximum of five seed packets, just like you would check out any other library material. All you need is a valid PCCLD library card. There is no due date, but feel free to collect seeds at the end of the growing period to turn back into the seed library for the next growing year.

Grow, harvest and then return the newly collected seeds to a Seed Library collection bin. In order to help keep the seed library going, we highly encourage growers to bring some seed back from their harvest. When you donate seeds, please provide:

You can now check out tools to plant your Seed Library seeds!

Available only at Rawlings Library, borrow up to five items for seven days.

Available tools include:

- Cultivators
- Hand trowels
- Hoes
- Pruners
- Rakes
- Shovels
- A yard cart

You can place an item on hold and there are five check outs per person, no renewals. All tools must be cleaned of soil and debris. If an item is returned dirty, a \$5 fine will be charged. Patrons will be charged a replacement fee for lost or damaged items.

Items are available for check out using a valid PCCLD library card.

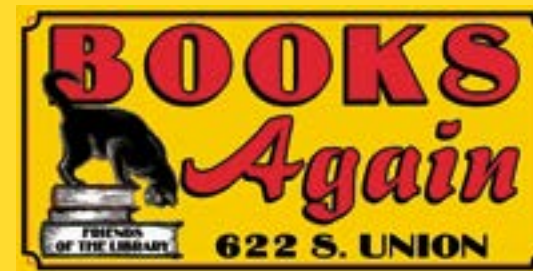

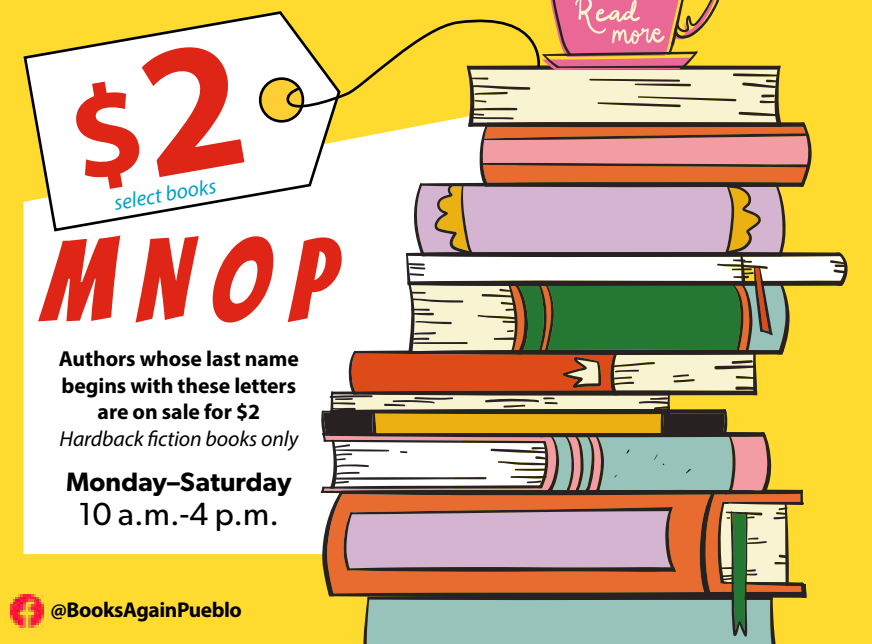

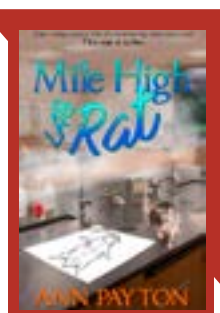
