Tool Library expands to Giodone Library

Starting April 26, you can check out tools from the Giodone Library to plant your Seed Library seeds!

Available tools include:

- · A goat head roller
- Garden knives
- Hoes
- Hoses
- Rakes
- Shovels
- · Wheelbarrows and more!

Library card holders can borrow up to five items for up to 28 days. Items can also be placed on hold through the online catalog; items cannot be renewed.

All tools must be cleaned of soil and debris. If an item is returned dirty, a \$5 fine will be charged. Patrons will be charged a replacement fee for lost or damaged items.

A limited number of garden tools are also available for check out from Rawlings Library.
