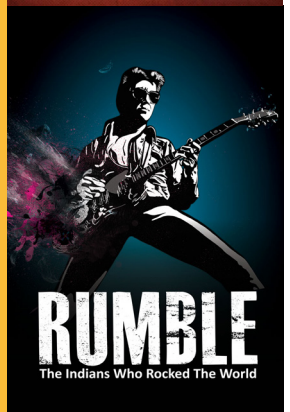

Elevator Modernization

UNDER CONSTRUCTION

We are modernizing the Rawlings Library elevators to improve safety, reliability and accessibility for all patrons and staff.

Project timeline and what to expect:

Work window: Early 2026 through early April 2026.

Access impacts: Public elevator availability will be phased to keep at least one public elevator accessible when possible; there may be periods when both are offline for testing and ongoing work. If both elevators are unavailable, PCCLD will plan alternative routes for patrons with accessibility needs.

Interim measures: Clear signage directing patrons to alternate routes and staff and security support for building access.

Contingency note: These dates may change. We will provide timely updates through the website, on-site notices, email lists, and social media.

We are committed to keeping staff and the public informed and to minimizing disruption. If you have mobility, access, or service needs, please contact library staff so we can arrange reasonable accommodations, priority access, or remote/reserved services during construction. Expect regular project updates on the Rawlings Library webpage and posted notices at building entrances. Thank you for your patience as we complete these essential upgrades to make Rawlings safer, more reliable, and more accessible for everyone.

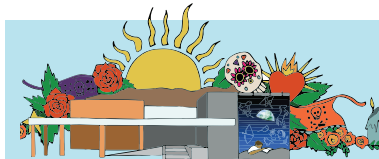
