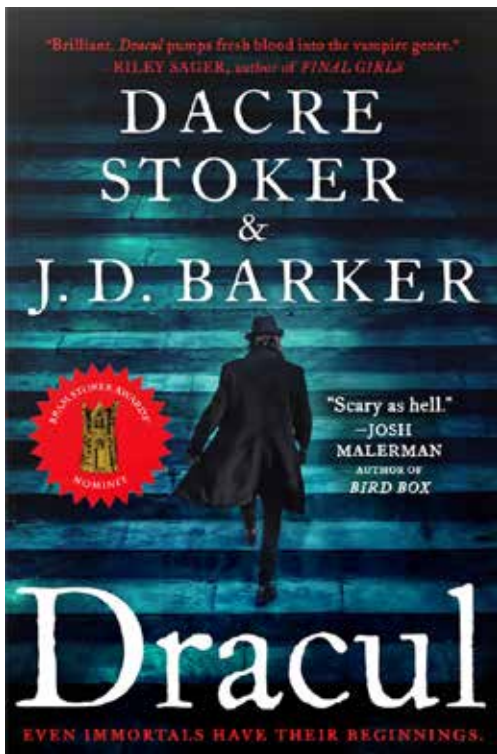

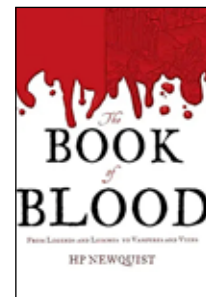

ALL PUEBLO READS KICKS OFF OCTOBER 3

Slink into the shadowy realm of vampires, folklore

Summer's sun has sunk below the horizon and autumn's shadows grow longer, prepare to sink your teeth into this year's All Pueblo Reads! From a Dracula prequel to the science of blood to a monster-hunting pig, the 22nd annual All Pueblo Reads literacy project promises to be a spooky good time.

This year's featured book is "Dracul" co-written by Bram Stoker's great grand-nephew Dacre Stoker and J.D. Barker. A moody, Gothic thriller taking place in 1868, 21-year-old Bram Stoker locks himself inside an abbey's tower to face off against a nightmarish beast. Armed with mirrors, crucifixes, holy water and a gun, Stoker attempts to survive the longest night of his life. "Dracul" is a stand-alone prequel to Bram's classic "Dracula" and is based upon the previously unpublished journal of Bram Stoker.

Stoker will be in Pueblo for

the sold-out Booklovers Ball on November 13, and the free public author talk on Saturday, Nov. 14. The public author talk starts at 11 a.m. in the Ryals Grand Event Space on the fourth floor of Rawlings Library. Doors open at 10:30 a.m.; refreshments will be provided.

On Sunday, Nov. 15, Stoker will give a dramatic reading from the classic "Dracula" at 3 p.m. in the Ryals Grand event space.

He will give two in-person talks at local schools on November 16 and 17.

Leeches, vampire hunters, oh, my!

Young adult readers will dive into "The Book Of Blood: From Legends And Leeches To Vampires And Veins" by HP Newquist.

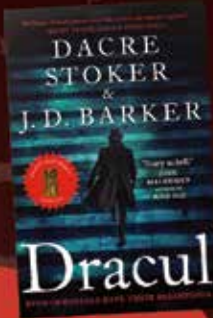

blood's myths, legends and the science of life's sticky most vital fluid.

Readers will meet the doctors and scientists who have tried to unravel the secrets of blood for centuries, beasts who need to drink blood to live, the amazing things that blood does as it pulses along thousands of miles of vessels and a few mythological creatures that might not be so mythical after all.

Newquist will give an author talk at local schools October 6 and 7.

Younger readers take a rip-roaring ride through the graphic novel "Ham Helsing: Vampire Hunter" by Rich Moyer. Protagonist Ham Helsing comes from a long line of monster hunters, but has always been the odd pig out, preferring to paint or write poetry instead of inventing dangerous (dumb) new ways to catch dangerous creatures. Moyer will visit local schools on October 13 and 15.

All Pueblo Reads kicks off October 3 at 11 a.m. at Rawlings Library with crafts, activities and a special presentation by the Rocky Mountain Paranormal Society. Free copies of "Dracula" and "Dracul" will be given away, so be sure to pick up your copy before they disappear into the night.

Together with the classic "Dracula" and "Dracul", these titles give us a layered All Pueblo Reads lineup, inviting readers of every age to step into the fog, listen for footsteps in the dark, and discover that sometimes the best stories have a little teeth to them. PCCLD expands AI literacy with BoodleBox

PCCLD has partnered with BoodleBox to expand AI literacy with a privacy-centered, ethics-first approach. On Tuesday, Sept. 22, PCCLD hosted events including a Lunch & Learn featuring BoodleBox leadership and training on “Human-in-the-Loop” practices and AI ethics. PCCLD is training staff first so they can responsibly guide the public, ensuring AI use protects privacy, intellectual freedom, equity and accessibility.

“As artificial intelligence rapidly reshapes how people access information, learn, work, and create, public libraries have an essential role to play as trusted guides. Through this initiative, we are prepar-

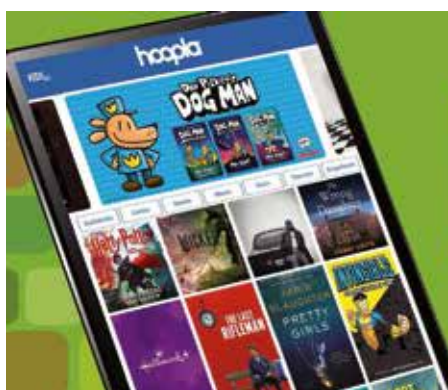
Online high school graduates honored

On Saturday, Sept. 19, Pueblo City-County Library District (PCCLD) celebrated seven graduates from Career Online High School (COHS), a program dedicated to helping adults, at least 21 years of age, earn their high school diploma and career certification online.

PCCLD’s program provides a limited number of scholarships to qualified adult learners who are looking to expand their career opportunities, prepare for workforce entry or continue their education. This program is not a GED program, but it is another way for student to receive their high school diploma.

To be considered for the program, applicants will successfully complete an online survey and prerequisite course, followed by an in-person interview, and a 30-day probationary period.

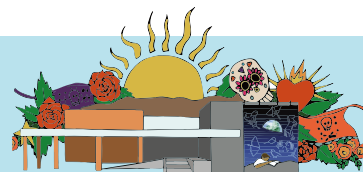

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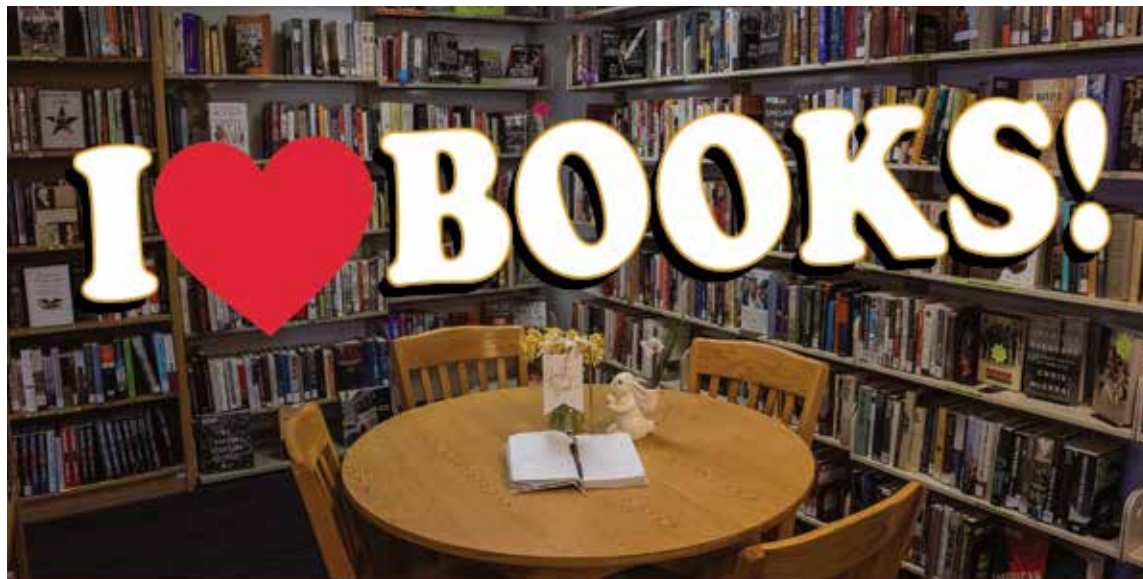
