**InfoSpace! events blast-off in March at the InfoZone**

**Pueblo, Colo.** — The InfoZone News Museum is launching space-related programs and activities throughout the month of March at Rawlings Library, 100 E. Abriendo Ave.

See planet earth in a new and exciting way! Beautiful satellite images of earth viewed from are featured in an exhibit from the U.S. Geological Survey and the Smithsonian Institution. Also on view is a model from NASA’s GRAIL Mission, on loan from Lockheed Martin and Astrophotography by Tom Northrup.

Saturday, March 2 from 10 a.m.-1:30 p.m., enjoy the night sky as the InfoZone Movie Theater is transformed into a planetarium, and stay for the matinee movie at 2 p.m. The Southern Colorado Astronomy Society will display telescopes and conduct hands-on learning activities every Saturday in March from 11 a.m.-1:30 p.m. Learn about the phases of the moon, eclipse and seasons with PCC students on March 2, 9 and 16 from 10 a.m.-noon.

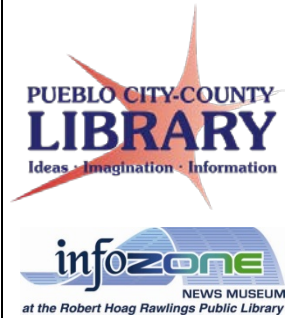
The Southern Colorado Astronomy Society will host a moon and star gazing sessions. There will viewings of comet PanStarrs on Tuesday, March 12 from 6-9 p.m. at the CSU-Pueblo observatory at the Nature Center and Wednesday, March 13 from 6-9 p.m. on the Rawlings 4<sup>th</sup> floor balcony. A night sky viewing will also be held on Thursday, March 21 from 6-9 p.m. in the Rawlings Library parking lot.

Christine M. Edwards Stewart, an aerospace engineer from Lockheed Martin, will give a presentation on Friday, March 15 at 2 p.m. in the InfoZone. She has been involved with Odyssey, Jupiter bound Juno, the Stardust mission, Project Orion, GRAIL and the JPL Solar System Ambassador Program. Refreshments will be served.

Bryan DeBates from the Space Foundation will also deliver a presentation about current happenings in space on Saturday, March 30 at 2 p.m. in the InfoZone. Learn more about the recent comet that passed near earth, the Mars Curiosity rover, the new Space Launch System, Space X and the Kepler and Cassini mission.

InfoZone News Museum is a division of the Pueblo City-County Library District. All events are free and open to the public. The museum’s mission is to provide broader knowledge of news and information. The museum focuses on journalism, the First Amendment, historic news and current events.
