## **November independent film at the InfoZone**

**Pueblo, Colo.** — *Marie's Story* (French with English subtitles subtitles) is the film playing at the InfoZone Theater in the Rawlings Library, 100 E. Abriendo Ave., on Saturday, Nov. 19 at 6:30 p.m. This is the last showing of the year, films will resume in January.

At the turn of the nineteenth century, a humble artisan and his wife have a daughter, Marie, born deaf and blind and unable to communicate with the world around her. Desperate to find a connection to their daughter and avoid sending her to an asylum, the Heurtins send fourteen-year-old Marie to the Larnay Institute in central France, where an order of Catholic nuns manage a school for deaf girls. Based on true events, *Marie's Story* recounts the courageous journey of a young nun and the lives she would change forever, confronting failures and discouragement with joyous faith and love.

Independent films shown in the InfoZone are award-winning movies, honored at many notable festivals held each year around the world. The movies are works by up-and-coming directors from countries such as Canada, Brazil, India Denmark and Italy. The movies are not rated, and recommended for viewers ages 17 and older. Held on the third Saturday evening of each month, Independent Film Night is free to attend, and seating is on a first-come, first-served basis.

The InfoZone News Museum is a division of the Pueblo City-County Library District. All events are free and open to the public. The museum's mission is to provide broader knowledge of news and information. The museum focuses on journalism, the First Amendment, historic news and current events.
