Documentary spotlights the human relationship to environment

Pueblo, Colo. — The documentary *We Know Not What We Do* will play on Monday, April 17 from 5 to 8:30 p.m., in the InfoZone Theater-4th floor of the Rawlings Library, 100 E. Abriendo Ave. Produced by Aaron Taylor and created and directed by Elizabeth Gaylynn Baker, *We Know Not What We Do* is a tough but tender plea to human beings. It presents both the voice of love and the voice of reason, as it sets out to creatively examine the most important challenge of our time: man's relationship to his environment.

The documentary also presents the story of this very misunderstood relationship, and how the misunderstanding has caused destruction in both the biosphere and the biodiversity of planet Earth.

Not presented as an angry expose, *We Know Not What We Do* spotlights areas, both rural and urban, and people, both victims of the destruction and the leaders in stopping the destruction, interviewing some of the brightest minds alive today. The film discovers exactly what is being sacrificed because of our unbridled addiction for fossil fuels and examines the lack of will that we are displaying in solving this crisis.

The documentary explores our ideas of "wealth," and questions our misconceptions of expansion and economic growth. Can we cut back, cut down or even completely change our course, vying for alternative sustainable energies, without throwing our world into chaos? Can we shift our priorities? Is it possible for our species to become a tight knit community of human beings that can work together for survival?

As many ignore this puzzle altogether, *We Know Not What We Do* urges us to face this challenge, solve the dilemma, or run the risk of extinction.
