Award-winning French-Chadian independent-film

PUEBLO – *A Screaming Man*, the InfoZone News Museum's independent film choice for February, is a drama from Chad, France and Belgium that follows an ex-swimmer struggling to stay afloat in the war-torn country of Chad.

Adam, a former swimming champion in his sixties, is a pool attendant at a hotel in Chad. When the hotel is taken over by new Chinese owners, he must give up his job to his son, Abdel, leaving Adam humiliated and bitter. Meanwhile, the country is in the throes of a civil war. Rebel forces are attacking the government and the authorities demand the people to contribute to the "war effort" with money or volunteers old enough to fight. Adam is constantly harassed for his contribution, but he is penniless. In a moment of weakness, Adam makes a decision that he will regret forever.

A Screaming Man will be shown at 7 p.m. on Saturday, Feb. 18. Doors to the library open for movie attendees at 6:30 p.m., and the movie begins at 7 p.m. *A Screaming Man* is filmed in French and Arabic with English subtitles.

Independent films shown in the InfoZone are award-winning movies, honored at many notable festivals held each year around the world. The movies are works by upand-coming directors from countries such as Canada, Brazil, India Denmark and Italy. The movies are not rated, and recommended for viewers ages 17 and older. Held on the third Saturday evening of each month, Independent Film Night is free to attend, and seating is on a first-come, first-served basis.
