**Award-winning Australian independent-film**

**PUEBLO** – *Little Sparrows*, the InfoZone News Museum’s independent film choice for April, is a drama from Australia that follows the story of three sisters dealing with their mother’s terminal breast cancer.

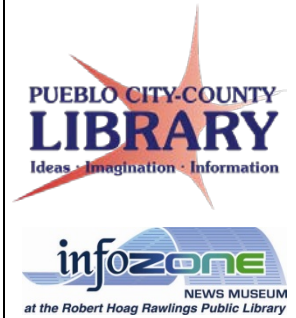
In the middle of an Australian summer, three sisters are preparing for the holiday season. Nina is widowed with two young children. Anna is an aspiring actress unhappily married to a filmmaker. Christine is a medical student who has yet to fully come to terms her sexuality. When their mother Susan’s breast cancer returns, the family is faced with the reality of their last Christmas together. As each daughter confronts personal change and growth, Susan guides them by revealing a secret of her own.

*Little Sparrows* will be shown at 7 p.m. on Saturday, April 21. **Doors to the library open for movie attendees at 6:30 p.m., and the movie begins at 7 p.m.** *Little Sparrows* is filmed in English.

Independent films shown in the InfoZone are award-winning movies, honored at many notable festivals held each year around the world. The movies are works by up-and-coming directors from countries such as Canada, Brazil, India Denmark and Italy. The movies are not rated, and recommended for viewers ages 17 and older. Held on the third Saturday evening of each month, Independent Film Night is free to attend, and seating is on a first-come, first-served basis.
