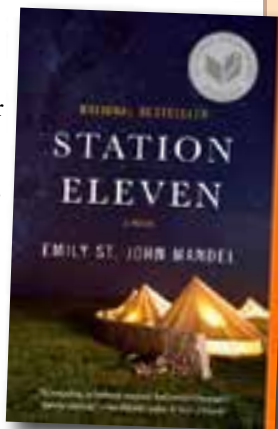
October 2017 marks Pueblo City-County Library District's 13th consecutive year of All Pueblo Reads.

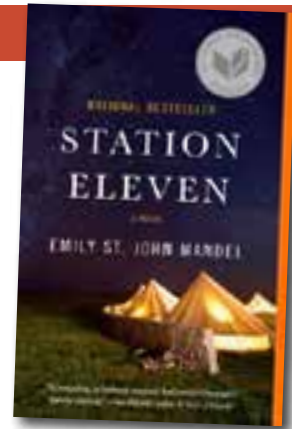

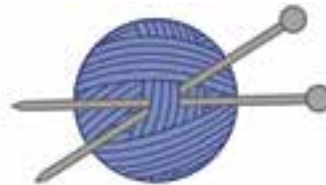
