Library wins another award

The Institute of Museum and Library Services today announced Pueblo City-County Library District of Pueblo, Colorado as one of 10 recipients of the 2018 National Medal for Museum and Library Service, the nation's highest honor given to museums and libraries that make significant and exceptional contributions to their communities. Over the past 24 years, the award has celebrated 182 institutions that are making a difference for individuals, families, and communities. The award will be presented at an event at the U.S. Institute of Peace in Washington, D.C., in May.

Pueblo City-County Library District seeks to provide the best possible library service for its community. There are eight facilities each providing a complete range of library activities. These include information services such as readers' advisory, reference, and information literacy instruction, robust collections of library materials for public use including print, video, and audio formats; local history and archival collections, interlibrary loan, online and digital services, public meeting rooms and plenty of space for individuals and groups of all



sizes to study and exchange ideas, and wide-ranging cultural and educational programs and events.

"It is a pleasure to recognize the 10 distinctive recipients of the National Medal of Museum and Library Service," said IMLS Director Dr. Kathryn K. Matthew. "Through their programs, services, and partnerships, these institutions exemplify the many ways that libraries and museums are positively transforming communities across the nation."

Selected from 29 national finalists, the 2018 National Medal for Museum and Library Service winners represent institutions that provide dynamic programming and services that exceed expected levels of service. Through their

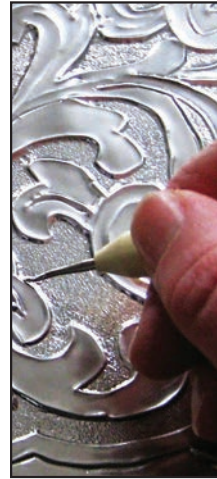

District has made for its community, and reinforce its commitment to education and public engagement."

As part of the ceremony and celebration, Pueblo community member Mandy Brown will travel to Washington, D.C. with Walker to accept the National Medal on behalf of the library district and provide a personal account of the power Pueblo City-County Library District has had in the community. Mandy found the library staff to be warm and welcoming. And when Mandy shared her fear of computers, librarians were quick to encourage her to enroll in one of the library's free computer classes. Now, Mandy spends most

of her days at the library, reading, studying, and using the library computer to access the internet. She is enrolled in a nursing program at a local community college and hopes to rejoin the workforce, all with the help of the library's support system. "The greatest thing you get at the Pueblo City-County Community Library is hope," said Mandy.

Following the ceremony, StoryCorps—a national nonprofit dedicated to recording, preserving, and sharing the stories of Americans—will visit the library and provide an opportunity for Pueblo community members to share stories of how Pueblo City-County Library District

has affected their lives. These stories are preserved at the American Folklife Center at the Library of Congress.

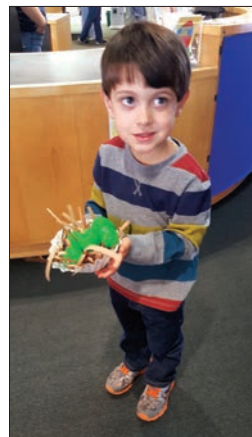

THE CERUTTI MASTODON DISCOVERY

A San Diego find reveals the earliest evidence of human life in North America.

In 1992, paleontologists from the San Diego Natural History Museum were surveying a highway construction site to identify and salvage any fossils that might have been unearthed. Field paleontologist Richard Cerutti spotted some bones and tusks. Exploring further, the team discovered that these were bones of a mastodon—an extinct relative of elephants. But Richard noticed something unusual. The bones were mysteriously broken and the pieces separated. It took 22 years for scientists to solve the riddle. Once they did, they realized that this local site is evidence of human presence on this continent 130,000 years ago—much earlier than we thought possible.
