It is important to work and invest on an ongoing basis in working to keep up-to-date in much of what we do. This certainly includes continuous improvement of information technology (IT) in today's world, where the changes seem to happen at a lightning

pace. The Pueblo City-County Library District (PCCLD) recently upgraded key components of its IT infrastructure.

PCCLD successfully migrated our public libraries to new wide-area network connections and Internet services as of July. This change includes faster speeds for much of the data network, moving from a one gigabit per second service to ten gigabits per second. The library Internet also is swifter, speeding up from 400 megabits per second to one gigabit per second.

Information Technology and the library One gigabit equals one billion bits of data, so this makes for really fast computer, tablet, and smartphone connections. The upgrades include new network equipment, such as switches and firewall systems. These better ensure our data services work reliably as well as fast. Much of these changes are funded with special grants to PCCLD valued at over \$200,000.

> This robust network infrastructure is important. Every day PCCLD serves thousands of customers who seek to meet their individual information needs. Much of this happens online in today's library. For example, public-use computing is a key component of library service. In 2017, there were 594,983 public computer sessions in our local libraries. This increased a whopping 289 percent in the first six months of 2018 to more than 1,185,382 sessions so far this year.

> PCCLD is pleased to be able to provide this service to help fulfill our mission of free and open information access and lifelong learning for all Puebloans.







Extreme Exploration


