Choose successful libraries, stay Pueblo proud

upport for public libraries is a choice. Innumerable communities across the nation for generations have chosen support for public libraries. Our nation's founders noted the significance of libraries to the success of our democracy. This tradition includes Pueblo where support for public libraries is notable. Local citizens have decided public libraries provide an enduring value for the people who live, work and go to school here.

Is the investment worth it? The answer is ves according to a 2017 study. For every \$1 invested in public libraries, communities realize an average return of \$4.64 in access to books and other materials, services and programs, and information technology (https://www.tsl.texas.gov/roi). Our libraries provide inviting and comfortable public places dedicated to learning and literacy, reading and education for all ages.

This outstanding return on investment is even better here. The award-winning Pueblo City-County Library District (PCCLD) exceeds averages by every measure, including its selection in 2018 as a Four Star Library,

America's Best Library, the Colorado Library of the Year and the National Medal for Museum and Library Service

You also may know Pueblo's libraries are at risk now. I wrote about this in last month's newsletter column ("Library at a crossroads," http://www. pueblolibrary.org/sites/default/ files/sites/default/files/pdf/ newsletters/2019_march_ newsletter.pdf). To reiterate here briefly, one stipulation of

the Gallagher Amendment to Colorado's constitution is causing declining revenue for Pueblo's libraries due to rapidly increasing housing costs in Denver. This peculiar provision is negatively impacting numerous public institutions outside Denver, and a September 13, 2018, study by the State Legislative Council shows PCCLD is the most harmed library district in the

entire state (http://leg.colorado.

gov/sites/default/files/images/

committees/2017/bill_5_fiscal_ note.pdf).

We have options. One choice is to accept the Gallagher revenue reductions and the consequent decrease to services and hours and closing local libraries. For example, an analysis shows that by closing two local branch libraries the upcoming Gallagher funding shortfall could be resolved for now.

We have an alternative. A library mill levy voters passed in 1999 is set to expire at the end of 2019. Voters could be asked to simply reauthorize the mill levy rate now paid to support our local libraries. Without raising taxes, this would mean the individual owner of the average home would continue paying \$6.95 per year or 58 cents a month. This small amount would have big impact. Renewing this modest tax would allow PCCLD to sustain itself, operate well and positively serve the community in the future without closing libraries or reducing services.

There undoubtedly are other possibilities to grapple with this problem. Whatever those are, it is time now to decide. The choice will have profound impact.





The VITA program was designed by the IRS to offer **FREE** e-filing (federal and state) for individuals and families with a household income of \$55,000 or below. **Note:** VITA **cannot** prepare taxes for businesses, partnerships, rental/multiple properties, international returns, and/or inheritances. **Bring ALL of the following items for you and your dependent(s) if applicable:**

- Photo ID
- Social Security Card (s) (for taxpayer and dependents, MUST have all cards
- Birthdate(s)
- If covered by the Affordable Care Act for health insurance, bring form 1095A or 1095B
- A copy of last year's tax return (if applicable)
- Wage and earning statement(s) Form W-2, W-2G, 1099-R from each employer
- Interest and dividend statement from banks (forms 1099)

- Bank account number and routing number if you desire a direct deposit (some locations have bank representatives available to open an account)
- If filing a joint return, both spouses must be present to sign required forms
- If you have purchased a home in 2018, bring all mortgage documentation
- If claiming day care expenses, total amount paid and daycare provider's Tax ID number
