



Trustee talk



PCCLD provides a great return on investment.

When I became a member of the PCCLD Library Board in 2013, I studied the duties of

trustees in the Colorado Public Library Board and Trustees Pocket Handbook. I found that this district's board is a governing board of trustees, having fiscal and legal responsibility for the control and management of the library. One of our main duties is to "secure adequate funding and practice responsible fiscal management of the public money." In other words, we have the oversight responsibility for the financial operations of the district. There are a number of policies and procedures which govern the operations of the district to ensure effective cash management, compliance with governmental accounting regulations and good business practice.

Each month the board is provided with detailed financial information, prepared by the finance office. At each meeting the chief financial officer presents this report. In carrying out our duties, we also contract to have an annual audit performed by a certified public accounting firm. This is a requirement of Colorado State Law. The audit this year gave us a clean report as has been our experience in the past. The Government Finance Officers Association has awarded a Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting to PCCLD for its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for four straight years. The district also received the Distinguished

Budget Presentation Award from GFOA for the 2012 and 2013 budget documents. The chief financial officer and her staff are to be commended on their efforts to consistently and accurately maintain the financial records of the district.

We are also responsible for all budgetary resolutions and approvals and for setting the mill levy annually. We are heavily reliant on taxes to support our operations. Taxes provided 91.7 percent of the district's total revenues in 2013. Additional sources of money include miscellaneous fees and gifts and earned interest. Program revenues cover only 5 percent of our operating expenses. This means that the taxpayers and the district's other general revenues fund 95 percent of our activities. As a result, the general economy and the changes in both residential and commercial property values have a major impact on the district's revenue streams.

The members of the board of trustees of the district are acutely aware of our fiduciary responsibility for your tax dollars. The mission of the district is to serve as a foundation for our community by offering welcoming, well equipped and maintained facilities, outstanding collections and well-trained employees who provide expert service encouraging the joy of reading, supporting lifelong learning and presenting access to information from around the world. To advance our mission, we continually monitor and evaluate the finances of PCCLD, to ensure we are expending our funds judiciously and in the best interest of our stakeholders; the patrons and taxpayers.
