Rawlings' second-floor facelift

You may have noticed that something is happening on the second floor of the Rawlings Library.

Some sections have already moved, and this is only the beginning

of changes that will be seen in the reference and readers advisory area at the Rawlings Library.

The Library Enhancement Project on the first floor of the Rawlings Library, and at the Barkman, Lamb and Pueblo West libraries in 2013, is moving to the second level of Rawlings Library in 2014. Computers, DVDs, books and other materials will remain, but will be repackaged into areas encouraging imagination, ideas, information and independence.

The now empty shelves in the "sky wing" will promote imagination through adult large print and fiction collections. Books will be available for passionate readers, and additional space will be available for customers to sit and use their own devices, or those checked out from the library's Center for Information Technology.

Ideas will continue to originate in the non-fiction area. The direction of the shelves will be changed, but cookbooks, auto repair manuals, self-help

books, yoga instruction, biographies, etc., will be in a newly carpeted, attractively arranged area for browsing.

And information will abound in the spacious technology/media center. Computers, iPads, DVDs, CDs other media, and the new Teen Central will be found in this area. An added attraction will be a glassed-in makerspace, a gathering workspace used for creation, collaboration, innovation and entrepreneurship.

In order to complete these renovations, the second floor of Rawlings Library will be closed and unavailable in February. Never fear, computers and materials will be temporarily moved to meeting rooms on the first floor and staff will pull requested materials to place on hold shelves during the month of renovation.

Watch for the announcement for the grand opening of the exciting, new area of the library that encourages imagination, ideas, information and independence!



The annual debutante ball in Laredo, Texas is unlike any other. Part of the largest celebration of George Washington's birthday in the world, a 114-year tradition, a select group of mostly Mexican-American girls is chosen each year to dress in elaborate gowns representing iconic figures from America's colonial history. Their goal: to recreate a party hosted by Martha Washington, but this time set along the US/ Mexico border. Las Marthas follows two of the girls as they prepare for this extraordinary rite of passage.

Shun Li and the Poet, Saturday, Jan. 18 at 7 p.m. Italian and Mandarin with English subtitles



Shun Li works in a textile factory near Rome, slowly paying off the broker that brought her from China to Italy, while saving money so she can bring her young son to join her. She is suddenly transferred to work as a bartender at a pub in a small town along the Venetian Lagoon. The pub is the hangout of the local fishermen, including Bepi; a handsome old Slav immigrant nicknamed "The Poet." A tender, delicate friendship grows between Shun Li and Bepi. But gossip soon threatens their innocent relationship, a bond that had once transcended two very different, yet not at all distant cultures.

I am Malala : the girl who stood up for education and was shot by the Taliban by Malala Yousafzai Monday, Jan. 6, 7 p.m.

When the Taliban took control of the Swat Valley in Pakistan, one girl spoke out. Malala Yousafzai refused to be silenced and fought for her right to an education. On Tuesday, October 9, 2012, when she was fifteen, she almost paid the ultimate price. She was shot in the head at point-blank range while riding the bus home from school, and few expected her to survive.

Instead, Malala's miraculous recovery has taken her on an extraordinary journey from a remote valley in northern Pakistan to the halls of the United Nations in New York. At sixteen, she has become a global symbol of peaceful protest and the youngest nominee ever for the Nobel Peace Prize.


