Stretching toward success

A few years ago, we undertook a bold goal. We aspired to make PCCLD a top public library district not only in the state and this region, but also the entire nation. In order to reach this lofty ambition, we set several tasks for ourselves. Among these was expanding access to public libraries in underserved areas of the county. Now, in 2014, we are well on our way toward meeting this objective with three new libraries currently under construction and scheduled to open to the public before year end.

The specific locations for the three new libraries were carefully selected. An important criteria was to decrease citizen separation from access to public library services.

Some of the separation to access is geographical in character. The new St. Charles Mesa Library is an example of this. It is being built at a site that is located east of the city of Pueblo at the corner of U.S. 50 and 24½ Lane, which is several miles from current full-service public libraries. This area is noted for its rural ambience, but also now includes newer neighborhoods along with older, more established businesses and housing.

The second new library also is bridging a geographical gap. The Greenhorn Valley Library is being erected in Southern Pueblo County near Greenhorn Mountain and the Wet Mountains. It will serve Colorado City, Rye and the surrounding area. It is physically located more than 25 miles from the nearest full-service public libraries.

The third new library is closing a different kind of separation. A divide that is socio-economic in nature. The Patrick A. Lucero Library on the city of Pueblo's East Side is being built at the corner of Seventh Street and Monument Avenue in a busy urban setting that is located in one of the poorest neighborhoods of our community and near schools, neighborhood housing, parks, businesses and churches.

Each of these three libraries should be bustling settings for children, students and adults. Each will feature plenty of books and other library materials for our customers to read and use. They also will include public-use computers, quiet spaces for study and learning, plus meeting places for groups of people to gather to exchange information and ideas. Finally, each will include expert librarians and other staff to assist customers.

The new libraries are being built with funds provided by taxpayers as well as significant donations from philanthropic individuals and organizations. PCCLD will operate these libraries with the same high standards and offering the same level of service as it does at other outlets throughout the county.

There is little doubt that PCCLD is reaching higher to be the best that it can be. Our stretching to open and operate these three new public libraries in underserved areas of the county is a prime example. For information on the new libraries, visit www.pueblolibrary.org/newlibraries.

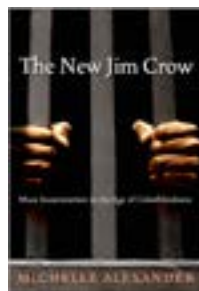

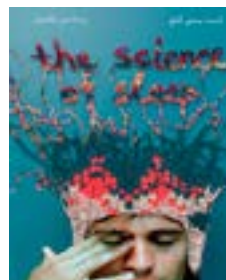

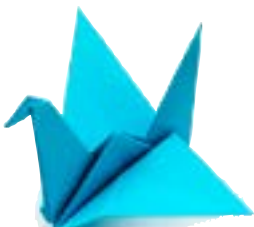

Trustee talk

The library and Internet neutrality – why should any library user pay attention to such an abstract and seemingly unrelated concept?

Libraries of today are no longer only about books. Indeed, books are becoming a diminishing component of our library's collection and service. The library is more about delivering "digital" services than exclusively print services. PCCLD depends greatly on the Internet to deliver its digital services. For example, we have computers in all of our libraries for anybody who wishes to use them, and many users are individuals without high-speed access at home. We offer 24/7 access to our services from home including access to databases.

Libraries such as PCCLD today are in the information business. We believe that public access to information is at the heart of the mission of the modern library and essential to our democracy.

So, what is Internet neutrality and why is it important? Initially the Internet was set up in such a way that all distributors of information would have equal access to the Internet public within the technical capabilities of the system. Recently, a judge declared that such a structure is unconstitutional, thus paving the way for those individuals, groups, corporations, etc., with greater financial resources to jump to the head of the line and

have their messages delivered first — ahead of those with fewer financial resources. The Federal Communications Commission is charged with creating a structure that would reflect the court's direction.

These actions have set off a firestorm of debate across the country, and the libraries in this country have been an important part of the debate. It has not just been the libraries that object to these changes but the larger governmental and non-profit sections as well. There is concern that those with the resources such as Google and Microsoft, for example, will so jam the "pipes" of the Internet that data from institutions such as the library will be so slow as to diminish the usefulness of the information for library patrons. The fear has been expressed that there might not be enough room for the transmission of any data for/from the less financially fortunate.

Such an outcome may or may not be the financial result of a non-neutral Internet. The FCC has not yet finished its work. But it is important for patrons of PCCLD and public libraries to inform themselves of the merits of this debate and to inform the FCC and their national representatives of their opinion. A slowing of access or the ending of access of information to the public is a potential threat to the mission of the public library. Information feeds the citizen's ability to stay informed and to be conversant with issues and to express his/her educated viewpoint to the responsible leaders.
