I have a confession to make. I love this place! Don't you? I mean what's not to love? The public library as an institution is one of the pillars supporting our wonderful democracy. It stands as a beacon offering free and open access to the human record in all its formats — books, audio, video, online. Libraries represent all points of view — left, right and the middle — and regardless of your age, financial means or standing in the community, we serve you.

There are six principles I believe are important for keeping our library moving forward and reaching toward the next level.

First, we must articulate succinctly what the public library is and its value to our community. I touched on this value above.

Fourth, the library is a place, a physical place — a comfortable place to read, study, and to gather to exchange ideas.

Fifth is our online presence. Libraries are service, libraries are collections, libraries are place; but in the modern era we also must be virtual, electronic, online. People expect to be able to click on the library from their home or school or office.

Sixth — not last but in this spot only for emphasis — we are people. The employees of the library district are our most valuable and valued asset.

Well, this is a little bit about what I think about libraries.

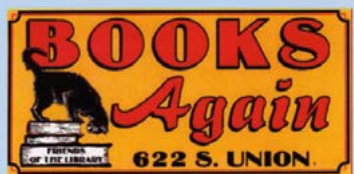

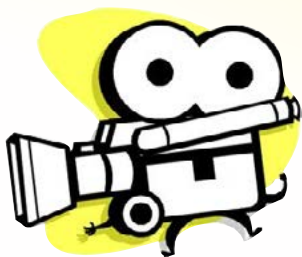
