PCCLD launches new online services!

Pueblo City-County Library is pleased to offer two new services through the library's website at www.pueblolibrary.org. Pueblo County residents can now sign up for a PCCLD library card and pay overdue fines via the Internet.

How to sign up for a new library card online

By following the easy instructions at www.pueblolibrary.org, customers will be issued a temporary library card. Customers will have immediate access to place holds for desired books and movies.

Within 24 hours, customers will have access to the library's remotely accessible online resources, including databases and downloadable audiobooks. Customers who wish to check out materials from a library location will be asked to upgrade to a permanent library card. Just bring a picture ID and proof of your current address to any location to upgrade your card!

Go to www.pueblolibrary.org. The link to register is located on the home page under "My Account." Click on "New to the Library? Click here to register online."

How to make online payments

PCCLD now offers online payment of library fines and fees using Paypal or your credit card.

Pay your bill from home, from the library's Internet stations, or at a Catalog computer in the library, by following these instructions:

- Log in to your library account by clicking "My Account" on the library's homepage.
- Click Review My Account and enter your library card number and PIN.
- Click Display User Information. Bills are displayed below current checkouts.
- Click Pay Bills at the bottom of the screen and follow payment instructions to pay with credit card or PayPal account.

The minimum payment is \$5. Customers may choose to pay a single bill that is greater than the minimum payment, or may pay their entire balance. (They cannot choose to pay specific bills).

If your account was blocked, you can restore access immediately by paying your bill online. If you have questions about your library fines or fees, call the Rawlings Library Circulation Department at 562-

Developing the Whole Collectionby Jon Walker

The use of library materials has never been greater. The number of books and other items checked out from the Pueblo

City-County Library District is increasing at a rate of 17% in this year alone. Use has increased 65% in the last five years. Why are we so popular?

Certainly, the number of new items on our shelves is part of the story. We have focused in recent years on doing a better job of selecting new materials that people want to use, and this, undoubtedly, is showing up in the increasing volume of business we continue to experience. In each of the past several years, for example, we have budgeted a moderate but steady increase in expenditures on fresh materials. We also improved our procedures for selecting new items a few years ago, and this positive change has contributed to the growth in business. We are pleased with this progress. However, we can do even better.

One area where we can improve is in what librarians refer to as de-selection of library materials. Just as it is important to procure new items which meet the reading, listening, and viewing needs of our community, so, too, is it key to remove materials from the collection when they are no longer useful. A good library focuses attention on this aspect of building an excellent collection, and should have procedures in place to regularly and systematically cull items that are no longer desirable. Items that are out-of-date, worn out, or no longer used should be regularly and consistently considered for withdrawal from the collection.

Librarians commonly refer to this process as "weeding." Just as a well-weeded garden will produce better flowers and vegetables, so, too, will a well-weeded library collection produce better results for customers, including increased usage.

S.R. Ranganathan, the notable twentiethcentury librarian and mathematician, stated in his famous "Five Laws of Library Science" that "Books are for use" and "The library is a growing organism." Ranganathan understood that libraries are not so much about storing materials as they are about promoting their use. He also taught us that libraries evolve and change to insure the materials within the collection are those that are advantageous to people. Part of Ranganathan's viewpoint certainly included insuring the library's collection is regularly pruned of deadwood in order to promote a healthier collection.

Will Manley, a well-known contemporary librarian, also appreciated this value when he wrote: "Next to emptying the outdoor bookdrop on cold and snowy days, weeding is the most undesirable job in the library. It is also one of the most important. Collections that go unweeded tend to be cluttered, unattractive, and unreliable informational resources."

De-selecting materials from the library has many benefits. It saves space. It saves time for customers, as shelves crowded with old and unused materials are a clutter, not a positive. By carefully weeding, we make the collection more appealing. Use increases simply by making the shelves more customer friendly and attractive, even when there are actually fewer items. We also improve the library's reputation for reliability, authority, and currency. People expect library materials are carefully selected and the information is up-to-date and reliable.

We have set objectives for ourselves at the Pueblo City-County Library District to improve our de-selection efforts. Unfortunately, this is an area we have neglected in recent years. But it is not too late. It is better to start now, than to never start at all. So, we are establishing these procedures now and will be implementing them in the coming months. This effort will make our library even better than it is today

In the Beginning.... by Edna Shoaf

A lady walked into Books Again the other day while I was in the front close to the front desk. She stopped suddenly and looked around as if she was lost, and then she began talking about the changes which she saw. She said she hadn't been in for a long time, so she had never seen the back room opened up like it is now. I took her on the grand tour, and she kept oohing and aahing and saying she couldn't believe how big and roomy the store is, and how many books there were, and on and on.

When the lady went on with her shopping, I stopped and took a good long look at the store, trying to see everything as if I had never been there before. I was totally startled because I have worked there for what seems ages and have grown accustomed to Books Again as it is now. That set me on a walk down memory lane to when I first became acquainted with the Pueblo Friends of the Library.

I moved to Pueblo in November of 2000 from Norman, Oklahoma, where I had been active in their Friends of the Library. When I saw an announcement in the newspaper about the big book sale coming soon at the University, I went over to see if I could volunteer to help. I met Jane Milne, the President of Friends, and she immediately put me to work placing books on the long tables that had been set up. I also helped with the sale itself, digging around among the boxes and boxes on the floor to keep the tables full. What a mad crush of people with bags and baby strollers and boxes of books everywhere! Then, of course, after the sale was over, the left-over books had to be boxed up and returned to the warehouse. Jane asked me why I didn't apply to join the Friends Board; I did and was accepted as a member. I also found out that Margaret Benz was the person volunteering to box up all those huge mounds of books in the warehouse to get them ready for the once-a-year sale. During my six years on the board, discussions began about having a used book store over in the warehouse that could be open all year. Bud Benz did lots of feasibility studies about the population of Pueblo and the users of the library, and he presented a good argument about how successful he thought a book store could be.

And so it began, with Bud and Margaret and several other board members working long hard hours to get shelves up, finding a cash register, setting a price for renting the space from the library, installing different lighting, putting in a telephone, finding space in the back room for sorting, and gradually making sense out of all those books piled in boxes reaching almost to the ceiling. What a job! But it began to take shape, and in the summer of 2005, the Principles for Operation of the Friends Used Bookstore were put into place under the direction of a Managing Group consisting of Bud and Margaret Benz, Jim Stuart, Barbara Tuttoilmondo, Mario Aguilera, Jeanne Gardner, Dick Moran, and John Tappen, with Bud as Store Manager.

In July of 2005 Books Again opened its doors. The Managing Group had estimated gross sales for the first year of \$36,000 and the second year of \$45,000. What actually happened was that from July to December the gross sales were \$37,543.36. And the full year of 2006 had gross sales of \$58,147.07. The rest, as the saying goes, is history. Many changes have occurred, volunteers have come and gone, but the major emphasis behind the store has never changed: to provide Pueblo with a used book store, manned by all volunteers, which produces funds for all kinds of projects for the public library system. We have come a long way, baby, and I am proud to be one of the many volunteers who give of our time and our talents to provide such a lovely place for people to buy reading materials at budget prices. Therefore - a Very Merry Christmas from all of us at Books Again to you, the individuals who have made us so successful!
