## **Meeting @ Your Library** by Jon Walker

The Pueblo City-**County Library District** recently adopted the vision statement: Books & Beyond. This vision

signifies that just as surely as libraries are about books and reading, today we are more than this. For example, are you looking for a place for your club or organization to gather? Think library.

Yes, the library provides community meeting rooms to clubs and organizations. There are meeting rooms available at the Barkman, Lamb, Rawlings and White libraries. Offering meeting room space to community groups is another way the library serves its mission to support the free exchange of ideas.


Meeting room space is available on a first-come, first-served basis. Generally, rooms may be scheduled for groups of ten or more by contacting the library where you want to meet. Each room varies in size from smaller rooms of a few hundred square feet to spaces as large as 2,500 square feet and big enough to accommodate up to 175 people.

Normally, fees are not charged for notfor-profit organizations using the rooms during normal business hours. However, a nominal fee may be charged in other circumstances.

In addition to the regular public meeting rooms, the Rawlings Library is home to the Ryals Special Events Room. The Ryals Room is not considered a general use meeting room, and there is a rental charge in most cases. The Ryals Room includes a fully-equipped catering kitchen and enjoys a wonderful ambience atop the Rawlings Library overlooking the city of Pueblo from each of its two balconies. This room is used for every occasion from staff trainings and lectures to weddings and reunions.

Whatever your meeting need—club, company, community group and morethe library has facilities to help. Clearly, the library has moved beyond the book.



## Sabine

An intelligent, moving and beautiful portrait of Sabine, a 38-year-old autistic woman, filmed by her sister, the famous French actress Sandrine Bonnaire. Through personal footage filmed over a period of 25 years, it is revealed that Sabine's growth and many talents were crushed by improper diagnosis and an inadequate care structure. After a tragic five-year stay in a psychiatric hospital, Sabine finally finds a new lease on life in a home together with other young people



living with similar mental and emotional illnesses. This very intimate film also sends an urgent message to a society that still does not know how to properly take care of its citizens with physical and psychological disabilities.



Something is new at the Rawlings Library..... well I guess really something is almost always new since we are continually improving methods and users experiences. However, what I am referring to is the Informational Kiosks on the first three floors of the



library. The Friends of the Library and the Rawlings Library staff have been working on the design and implementation of the kiosks since last fall, and it feels great to finally see them in place. The vision for these kiosks was to create a shopping mall type information center that would help patrons locate the major areas of the library. I would like to thank Kathy Knox, Jon Walker, Desmond Grant, Midori Clark and all the guys in the Facilities Department for their help and collaboration with this project.

Each triangular kiosk

features a large back-lighted map of the floor you are on along with smaller maps of each of the other three floors and an index listing all the various areas of the library and where they can be found. The



other two sides have bulletin-board type displays, one dedicated to the Friends of the Library and Books Again Used Bookstore and the other to advertise library events. A special feature of the one on the main floor is the LCD style TV monitor that tells what is going on in each of the meeting rooms plus upcoming special events in the library.

These custom designed and fabricated kiosks were built to fit the black metal and light maple wood look of the lobbies in the library by a firm in Denver that specializes in custom displays. This \$16,000 project was fully funded by the Friends of the Library.

Since one side of the kiosk is dedicated to promoting Books Again and the Friends our challenge now is to find a volunteer who has good design skills to take these on as a project and keep them up to date with sales and events going on with our organization. Know anyone who would fit this need?

I hope you enjoy our new kiosks and find them useful.
