Summer reading for young people @ the library by Jon Walker

It's summertime, again. School is out. The grass is green and

the trees are leaved. For many, this is a time for vacationing and relaxation. But at your library, it's a busy time of the year.

Each and every summer, the library district presents programming, events and activities to promote and encourage summer reading among our youth. Our goal is simple. We aim to keep kids reading all summer long.

We don't focus on assigned reading or reading as work. Instead, we emphasize reading for fun. In fact, I often say things like, "Read the comics." "Read Manga." "Read graphic novels." "Read fun magazines." "Read whatever is entertaining." "Just read."

Why is it important for young people to read for fun during the summer? The short answer is by exercising reading skills during the summer, it helps keep them sharp for the next academic year in school. The more you read, the better you read. The better you read, the more apt you are to succeed, both in school and later in life.

There is plenty of evidence to back this up. According to the Library Research Service, "within the library and education communities, ongoing and past research studies also address the impact of summer reading as a means to enhance the development and retention of children's reading skills" (http://www.lrs.org/documents/fastfacts/263_summer_reading.pdf). Studies, dating back more than 30 years, consistently show that "more than any other institution, including the schools, the public library contributed to the intellectual growth of children during the summer" (Barbara Heynes, Summer learning and the effects of schooling, 1978, New York: Academic Press).

We are pleased at the Pueblo City-County Library District that our summer reading programs have been so successful. Summer reading at your library has grown in popularity each year since 2003. It is noteworthy that participation has increased from around 1,000 young people in 2004 to approximately 13,500 in 2009. This impressive growth in summer reading by our children and young adults can only mean good things for our community.

Participation in the summer reading program is both fun and free. In fact, kids and teens can earn great prizes simply for reading. For more information about joining our young people's summer reading program, visit your nearest public library, call 562-5603 or go online to www. pueblolibrary.org.



Do you own a boat, motorcycle, lawnmower, tiller, ATV, jet ski or other personal watercraft? With the weather warming up, it's time to start using them. If you need information on routine maintenance, tune-ups or repairs for these items, the library has an online resource just for you. Small Engine Repair Reference Center includes text as well as original photos and illustrations that guide you through every job and is available anywhere you have access to the Internet. The database offers assistance in providing routine maintenance, such as tune-ups and brake service, as well as extensive repairs involving engine and transmission disassembly. It even has information on snowmobiles and snow blowers for when the snow comes back.

It has been approximately a year and a half since I joined the Pueblo City-County Library District Board of Trustees. Last year when I introduced myself, I remarked on the genuine attention to collaboration and community-building among library personnel and volunteers. Since then, I have discovered

that this focus and subsequent practices are reinforced through thoughtful, authentic, and relevant dedication to quality professional development.

Professional development means much more than staff training; while the latter focuses on such activities as instruction in a new program and on policies and procedures, the former involves inquiry, problem-solving, brainstorming, and vision. Professional development provides the space and the time for creative and deep thinking, honors the expertise and ideas of the participants, and acknowledges that sustainable change takes time and patience.

Since joining the Board of Trustees, I have witnessed, heard about, and participated in quality professional development. I observed as the library personnel facilitated and learned from stakeholder focus groups that informed the strategic planning process. I have had the pleasure of listening to and learning from the various employee and volunteer reports during monthly board meetings that inform the trustees about the outstanding work that is being done in all areas of library work. Finally, I had the opportunity to participate in a professional development session designed for trustees, sponsored by the library, and conducted by Pat Wagner of Pattern Research, Inc. This session created the space and provided the time for board members to think about our role and how to best serve the PCCLD and its stakeholders.

All professional development requires dedication from the organizers and participants, and this dedicated collaborative effort shows in the fine work of the library district. Inquiry into practice, creative thinking, and hard work by all members of the library staff, volunteers, and the larger community are what have helped create the culture of excellence that has made PCCLD the 2009-2010 Colorado Library of the Year!
