



What a great way to get in touch with Colorado's rich history.

What Did You Learn Today? by Edna Shoaf

Someone...(Don't you just adore those nebulous terms such as "someone" or "they" or "those folk over there"? Now don't get me started about "them" and "us." Makes me think about cliques in school.) Now, where was I? Oh, yes, "someone" once said that a day is wasted unless one has learned something new.


Avondale Satellite News
