Virginia Sanchez, who is leading the workshop, is a historian, genealogist and freelance writer living in Denver, Colorado. She was a senior technical writer at US West for 20 years and has been researching her family history and genealogy for 20 years. She received a master's degree in technical communication from the University of Colorado at Denver and a bachelor's degree from the University of Wyoming.

Her published articles have appeared in *Colorado Heritage*, *New Mexico Magazine*, *La Herencia*, *BlueSky Quarterly*, and genealogical journals, such as the *Colorado Genealogist*, *New Mexico Genealogist*, and the *Colorado Hispanic Genealogist*. She has also presented her historical research of southern Colorado and northern New Mexico at conferences of the New Mexico Historical Society and to genealogical societies in Colorado, New Mexico and Wyoming.

She is a member of the Colorado Historical Society and the New Mexico Historical Society. She is immediate past president of the Colorado Society of Hispanic Genealogy and serves on the board of directors for Alianza de las Americas, a support group of the Denver Art Museum's Spanish Colonial collection. She was recently recognized by the Hispanic Annual Salute for her contributions to the community in the area of history.

Virginia is currently writing a book about Cucharas, Colorado that focuses on religious life, education, railroad, and agriculture. She has researched Cucharas for the past five years and has examined its acequia systems, plaza, railroad town, church, schools, and cemeteries.



pril ends the 48th fiscal year of the Friends of the Pueblo City/County Library District, so it seems appropriate to report to you some of the key accomplishments of our organization over the past 12 months.


Educational and Recreational Activities - The Friends had a direct, positive impact on many of Pueblo County's youth. The Friends:

- Were the judges for the Scary Story Contest. The winners received a booklet of the winning stories and a gift certificate.
- Presented Books Again gift certificates to the poetry authors at the Library's Poetry Contest awards ceremony.
- Sponsored the FOL Board's Youth Writing Contest and received 452 entries.
- Provided the gift certificates for the winners of the Create Your Own Dr. Seuss Contest.
- We are one of the sponsors of the seventh Pueblo Girl Essay Contest. Fourth and fifth grade girls submitted entries.
- Presented Most Improved Reader Certificates to area children. The awards ceremonies were held at local schools.
- Donated \$6,500 to the Pueblo City-County Library Districts' Summer Reading program.
- Awarded a \$3,000 annual scholarship to Ms. Elizabeth Flores, a library district employee seeking a Masters of Library Science.

Informational and Cultural Activities – The Friends:

- Contributed an additional \$5,000, for a total of \$15,000, for the White Branch expansion project.
- The Project Selection Committee of the Friends awarded funds for: a book cart for Teen Central, adjustable-height computer tables for the Accessible

Avenues project, matching funds for the Westward for Steel oral history project, signage and display shelving for the Barkman Branch, provided matching funds in the amount of

- Provided \$5,500 towards the printing and postage for News & Events. The newsletter is an important communication tool for informing the community of library programs, new services, and Friends' activities. The newsletter reached over 12,000 people and organizations last year.
