After she became interested in studying Shrikes, she learned how difficult it was to safely capture, band and release these birds. Not only did Craig develop and construct her own traps, she also developed her own safe handling methods; safety for the birds, the live mouse lure and the woman doing the banding too.

Susan has published several papers regarding longevity, nesting density, reproductive success, special behaviors and migration. She will share her insights into the lives of these amazing birds gained during the course of 18 years of study.

# **Trustee Talk** by Roy Miltner



Having recently come to the end of my first year on the Pueblo City-County Library District Board of Trustees, I reflected on what I learned during that time. Some

insights came from simply being in and around the several libraries—Rawlings and the satellites—and speaking with staff, volunteers and patrons. Other information came while in attendance at the board's monthly work sessions and meetings. The times of the library-board meetings, by the way, are posted in each library and are open to the public.

Several impressions stay with me. The first is the vitality and forwardthinking library staff. Change is not an occasional happening, but a constant, as the staff seeks out new and better ways to serve the public and stay on the very leading edge of the curve with efficient and laborsaving practices. It is perhaps the fact that I am somewhat "technologically challenged" that I am so awed by the present and proposed public offerings such as e-books and iPads, and the planned for, new electronic checkout procedures. Undoubtedly, the recent citation of Pueblo as one of the best cities for readers is due to this culture of progress by our library leadership and their diligence and hard work.

The second impression is how fortunate we are as citizens to have such a large number of library locations in our city and county. Our last work session was held at Craver Middle School in Colorado City. There, a part-time staff person makes the small public library's satellite available to citizens in the southern part of the county. Other such locations include Avondale Elementary, Beulah School of Natural Sciences, Cesar Chavez, North and South Mesa elementaries, Risley Middle School, Rye Elementary and Vineland Elementary—in addition to the four full-time, stand-alone libraries in Pueblo and Pueblo West.

The third impression is how far beyond being just a reader's service our library district truly is. The special programs for adults, teens and children, which occur with regularity throughout the year, is awesome. A perusal of the events planned for this year's All Pueblo Reads alone must convince the reader that PCCLD seeks to broaden and deepen the knowledge and skills of the whole community. Books in the Park, the annual summer reading program, Books Again Bookstore (run by volunteers of the Friends of the Library), InfoZone Museum with its cinematic offerings and frequent educational programs are but a few other examples of how diverse the output of the library district is.

Can you tell that I consider it a privilege to serve as a trustee?


The interests, studies and education of Roy Miltner are the sources of the development of the Books Again history section. Even though in the library one can always find things by the Dewey Decimal system, Miltner has gathered high-use topics in history so they are easier to find. Miltner was born in Pennsylvania and grew up in New Jersey. He received a degree in forestry (634.9) from Paul Smith's College in upper New York state. After working for two years as a land surveyor, he went back to college and seminary in Gettysburg, Penn. to become a Lutheran pastor (253) and study history (909). It is easy to see how he developed this passion for history!

Currently, he volunteers with Colorado Division of Wildlife, United Way (021.7), Friends of the Library, El Pueblo Museum, Curator of the Weisbrod Aircraft Museum (069), and is a board member of the Pueblo Medal of Honor Foundation and Pueblo City-County Library District. He works two days a week at Books Again, and three days a week at the Aircraft Museum.

There is an extensive World History section which is of extreme interest to Miltner. This section covers the ancient to modern world (930-990). Also of interest are specific biographies of American presidents from Washington to Obama, as well as collected biographies of the presidents (920). Don't miss military uniforms (355.14). There is also a special section on American history (973) from 1492-present. But wait, there's more! There are special looks on the history of ethnic groups such as Native Americans (970), African Americans (973), Asian Americans (917) and Latino Americanos (973.046). Look for the *Time Life* series, for example, the '60s and the roaring '20s (973.9). Also, there is expansion of the West (973), the Louisiana Purchase (973.4), cowboys of the West and women in history (978.02). Come in today to find special eras in history such as the American Revolution, Civil War, World War I and World War II. Also available, books on famous battles of the Civil War (973.708), Guadalcanal (940.542), Bataan (940.54) and Guantanamo (909.831). Lots of history on the Holocaust (940.53) and its survivors (940.53). If you still want more, have you ever seen the book, Dr. Seuss Goes to War? It is an editorial of cartoons of Theodor Seuss Geisel. Oh, the things you can find in the Books Again history section! There is no mystery to available history, thanks to Roy Miltner. Three cheers for a Dewey Man for all reasons!
