

Sum of Employee Views in Niche Academy Training Classes



Meeting Rooms

There were 463 meeting and study room reservations in Rawlings for the month of February. This is an increase of over 100 room uses from last month. 165 of those reservations were for the 4 meeting rooms on the 1st floor, while the other uses were for the multiple study rooms throughout the user services department. Meeting room use continues to climb each month and with the addition of the Thurston and Bret Kelly A rooms, we are anticipating even more usage in March! Jan Reed and Chris Sturdy continue to work very hard facilitating all of our usage while helping to troubleshoot how staff and patrons can use the rooms. A huge thank you to both of them for their extremely hard work both this month and in previous ones as well.

Makerspace

We are thrilled that we have hired Tina Martins-Gonzales as the makerspace educator! She will begin her work in March. We have finished cataloging the garden tools that will be lent out of the space in the Tool Library, (in partnership with the Pueblo Food Project) and we are simply waiting for storage to debut that collection. We are hoping this pilot program will pave the way for lending other types of tools in the future.

Museum Services

Alyssa Vargas Lopez has done an amazing job jumping right into the museum service office and is organizing the space as well as developing the panels and displays for our exhibit from Art Bridges featuring a contemporary art piece by Felix Gonzales Torres, a Cuban American artist, educator, and activist who created visual and experiential art with everyday objects. We are on track to have the exhibit up and running by our grand opening- thank you so much, Alyssa, for this amazing work!

User Services

Looking at the robust list of programs, and attendance that the members of the User Services department offered during February, you can see staff stay very busy with more than 60 offerings during the month and an average attendance of 18.

February was the final month for the library's Winter of Reading program, the program had a lot of interest and participation. The first 100 program participants received a mug for their entry, there were also three grand prize prize-packs awarded. Participants could submit multiple entries for the drawing by completing the tasks more than once. A total of one hundred and thirty-nine people participated in the program. Fifty-two patrons entered more than one time, with an additional 100 entries submitted.

The three grand prize winners were drawn by Sherri Baca, our executive director on <u>Youtube Live</u> on March 1st. Of the three grand prize winners, four entries were submitted. Participants entered the drawing up to 7 times.

During the month of February 74 meals were offered as part of the D60 lunch program offered through CACFP. The library purchased and offered an additional 14 snacks on 2/17 due to school closure from snow. We will continue working with the school to increase our offerings, based on youth participation.

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library continues to be a big hit with registrations currently reaching 2,125, of those 110 are new enrollments and 47 youth have graduated from the program.

AWE computer usage for the district included 402 sessions on AWE computers. Eighty two of those sessions were here at the Rawlings location.

Thea, and Jacque of the youth group have continued working to invite more youth to attend our family storytimes on Fridays, which is followed by the lunch program as well as adding in Fun Friday programming. These efforts have maintained the high storytime attendance, increased earlier in the year from a handful of attendees, to up to 42 during the month of February. Baby and toddler storytimes have likewise increased from minimal attendance to up to 37 attendees.

On the adult group side, Thad, one of the team's Program and Outreach Specialists has continued to fill the gap for technology trainings, including one-on-one help to eleven library patrons.

You can see by the robust list of programs, and attendance that the members of the User Services department stay very busy.


