

# Sol Abbott, Local Merchant, Passes Away After Operation

## Business and Civic Leader Had Owned And Operated Herman's Department Store For Several Years

Sol Abbott, owner and manager of Herman's department store at Northern and E. Evans, died at Parkview Episcopal hospital of surgical complications Tuesday night.

Attending physicians said the widely-known business and civic leader was admitted to the hospital for surgery Jan. 27.

The local merchant came here in July of 1942 from Salt Lake City, where he was vice president of the Paris Co. department stores. He

## Norway Turns Russians Down

### Will Line Up with Atlantic Powers in New Treaty

WASHINGTON, Feb. 1.—(AP)—The state department was obviously pleased Tuesday night by Norway's apparent determination to line up with the Atlantic powers, despite Russian pressure.

### RUSSIAN NOTE IS POLITELY TURNED ASIDE

The American government's position was made known officially about the same time that the Norwegian government was politely but firmly turning aside a Russian note objecting to the pact. This note was evidently designed to discourage Norway from joining in the agreement.

The reply released in Oslo Tuesday night showed that the Norwegian government, despite the fact that Russia is a neighbor with a common border, had taken a firm stand on two points:
