### **Genealogy and Special Collections**

The Department reopened to the public following renovations, on Tuesday, January 17. On average the department received 15-20 patrons per day for the first two weeks, with increased patronage in the succeeding two weeks.

Individual goals for department staff were created and entered into Paylocity.

A call was put out for branch and department managers to host LHG staff at their staff meetings, to provide training on LHG resources. All branch managers have arranged for training sessions.

On Thursday, January 12, 2:30-3:15 PM, Aaron Ramirez provided training to the User Services Department at the Rawlings Library, Bret Kelly B. Topics covered the origins of archival practice and basic principles and common inquiries of patrons coming into the department, and resources used to fulfill these needs. A pre and posttest survey was administered to learners. Five questions were presented, with learners responding on a 1-10 scale, corresponding to knowledge and/or comfort. The post test revealed a 17% increase in competency across the 13 respondents. See APPENDIX for questions and data.

1/26/2023: 15 learners and 2 instructors from The Learning Source were welcomed into the Department for a tour. Learners were primarily Spanish speakers. Maria Smyer provided information about HRC resources and Jasel provided information about the Genealogy collections, all in Spanish.

#### **Archives Projects**

Registration of archival patrons was met with little complaint. One patron complained, stating that the practice was unnecessary. Staff explained the reasons behind registering users. Approximately 20 patrons were registered in January.

Jasel is continuing inventory on two boxes of Genealogy records from a donation.

Anne Whitfield and Fran Cosyleon returned to the department to volunteer weekly, describing rock art panels featured in 35mm slides from the Colorado Rock Art Association collection.

Aaron and Cecily welcomed staff from the Sangre De Cristo Art Center to the department, and provided a tour of the vault. Included in the vault was a discussion about collection storage environments and issues connected to renovations and moving collections.

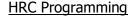

# **User Services**

January has been a month of increased attendance. We have seen the number of visits climbing overall, but especially within our youth area. In January the USD team took the training for the CACFP lunch program, which partners the D60 school system and the library together to offer lunches for area youth on Fridays, when youth do not have school.

During the month of January 106 meals were offered as part of this program. We are working with the school to increase our offerings, to make sure that youth have access to food.

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library continues to be a big hit with registrations currently reaching 2,070, of those 111 are new enrollments and 34 youth have graduated from the program.

AWE computer usage for the district included 312 sessions on AWE computers. Twenty-six of those sessions were here at the Rawlings location.

The new youth librarian, Thea, and Jacque of the youth group have worked hard to invite more youth to attend our family storytimes on Fridays, which is followed by the lunch program. With these efforts we have seen storytime attendance increase from a handful of attendees to up to 44 during January. Baby and toddler storytimes have likewise increased from minimal attendance to up to 43 attendees.

On the adult group side, Thad, one of the team's Program and Outreach Specialists has stepped in to help the district fill the gap for technology trainings, including one-on-one help. He is working to also begin offering computer classes within the computer lab.

Several USD team members have been working on the Winter of Reading Program, which began in January and has seen a high level of participation from Pueblo-area residents. This is the second year for the program, which is offered as a reading program for adults.

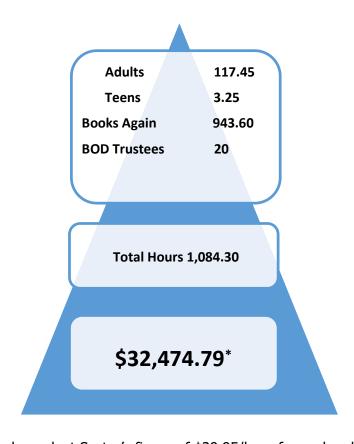
