

Sum of Employee Views in Niche Academy Training Classes



English Program

On Wednesdays we have Intermediate at Giodone and Lamb. On Mondays at 4:30 we have English Conversation at the Lamb library and at 10:00 am on Thursdays at the Rawlings library.

User Services

December has been a great month in User Services at the Rawlings Library. On December 12th the library welcomed a returning staff-member, Thea Martinez, as the new Early Literacy Youth Librarian. Thea returns to the district after having worked in the El Paso Library District as a Senior Library Associate. She is very excited to get started and has already begun offering story times and programs.



Within the building, most of the second floor remains the same. During the past few months there were many additions and updates, however maintaining what is currently in place has allowed patrons, as well as staff, to settle into the new floor layout. Many new self-check-out machines are up and running. Computers and printing services are in high demand.

The User Services Department offers seven study rooms for patrons to use, as well as a youth sensory room. Any of these rooms may be reserved in advance or used by patrons on demand, provided there are rooms

available. Three of the rooms were in place prior to the remodel, and four have been added as the space changed. During the month of December there were a total of 133 uses of study rooms, including 45 walk-in users.

This month all workstations and laptop vending computers are using Libdata, a connectivity and printing service that paired well with the chromebooks. The district elected to update workstations to this same software, making it easier for users to navigate library computers regardless of the device they use.

In tandem with the holidays the library offers two large events, the Gingerbread Jubilee and Noon Year's Eve. Both events were hosted by Jacque, of User Services, and garnered large attendance and participation. The Gingerbread Jubilee program was offered at the Pueblo Mall, the Pueblo Kiwanis assisted in offering this event to the public. More than 500 people attended!

Noon Year's Eve allows youth to enjoy new years without the need to stay up until midnight. One hundred people participated in the party. Pictures of both events are included.

AWE computers for children continue to be well used in the library district with 113 uses at Rawlings and a total of 355 within the district during the month of December. Each location currently offers one AWE machine.

The Imagination Library program gained 103 new registrations during the month and exceeds 20% of Pueblo County youth under age 5 population.

Although the pictures generally shared in the monthly reports generally showcase programs, these displays show USD staff efforts to decorate and beautify the second floor by CSR staff.




