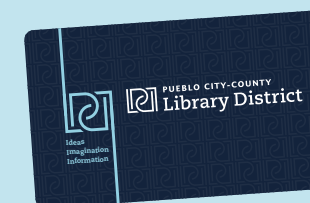


Access Pass
