

PCCLD launches telehealth service



Four telehealth kits are available for check out from Greenhorn Valley Library starting January 2. Each kit contains the items needed to conduct a telehealth visit with a health professional from Pueblo Health Solutions. Pueblo City-County Library District (PCCLD) will provide patrons living in Rye and Colorado City with means to access telehealth services at the end of January.

The Connect to Health initiative is part of a larger effort to increase access to virtual health services for rural communities. Pueblo City-County Library District is one of 23 rural libraries to receive funding and support from the Colorado State Library, the Office of eHealth Innovation and the American Heart Association to implement initiatives to increase telehealth access for their communities.

"Healthcare and access to healthcare and health information is a critical aspect of a person's physical and mental health and well-being. The Pueblo City-County Library District is very happy to partner with the State of Colorado in bringing access to telehealth services to the Colorado City and Rye communities," Sherri Baca PC-CLD's executive director said.

Health professionals from Pueblo Health Solutions will provide medical support to telehealth users.

At this time, four telehealth kits are available only at the Greenhorn Valley Branch Library, located at 4801 Cibola Drive in Colorado City. Each kit contains:

- A laptop
- WiFi hotspot
- Headset
- Pulse oximeter
- Digital thermometer
- Web camera and lights

• Secondary monitor For members of the public without internet access, a Wifi hotspot is included in the kits and they can check out the kit to use at home for one week. Kits are only available at the Greenhorn Valley branch and must be returned at this location.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), residents living in rural areas are more likely to die from chronic conditions including:

- Heart disease
- Cancer
- Chronic lower respiratory disease
- Stroke

The CDC continued that the reasons rural residents having a higher risk of dying of chronic conditions are due to:

• Longer driving distances to major hospitals, clinics or universities offering specialized care.

- Too few local clinics and not enough providers.
- Lack of access to medical technology.

These factors can make it difficult or impossible for rural residents to get services like mental health care, preventative checkups, adequate support for chronic conditions, or follow-up appointments with specialists.

Telehealth is one way that can

help connect rural residents with healthcare providers without the barriers of travel. Because of free internet access, libraries can further help connect area residents to health care providers.

"The public library remains at the crossroads of needs for information and services – we are proud to do this work and provide a meaningful addition to library offerings," Baca said.






