





DIRECTOR:

- Jill Kleven present various contracts to the Library Trustee Board at their work session on December 7th. These included 2024 contracts for Bibliotheca, RFID Library Solutions, Bywater Solutions, and Freegal Music. The board approved these contracts on December 14th.
- Jill conducted performance review meetings with the Technical Services staff.
- Jill attended Barkman/Lucero and Greenhorn Valley meetings to discuss collection maintenance and upcoming changes in Tech Services.
- Tech Logic came onsite to maintenance to the Rawlings AMH and fix the bookdrop door.
- Amy Nelson, Kayci Barnett, and Jill met to discuss the upcoming Leadership Academy which kicks off on Feb 1st, 2024. Applications from staff will be accepted through January 12th.
- Technical Services came up with their goals for 2024 which include solidifying a digital branch, starting an OCLC cataloging subscription, ongoing collection maintenance and inventory procedures, refreshing Rawlings nonfiction, creating an urban fiction collection and launching an eserials pilot for local and national newspapers at Rawlings.

COLLECTION DEVELOPMENT:

- Danielle Cowles began working with OverDrive to lower the price point of titles in our collection in order to manage the budget.
- The team is continuing to work with LibraryIQ to ensure that the data is correct before reports are sent out to staff regarding circulation and the collection.
- An influx of new materials arrived in December and the catalogers worked to get those items out.

 The QuickView and QuickRead programs are discontinuing. All copies will first be dedicated to holds.

CATALOGING:

 Peggy Bilger worked to get the new telehealth kits ready to launch at Greenhorn. The release date has been pushed back to February.

ILS:

- Theia Bravo has been continuing to work with the branches on the inventory project. Lamb, Y, PW, and Greenhorn inventory has all been completed.
