Lucero Library Update—The facility use agreement between the City of Pueblo and PCCLD will go before City Council during August. It is our hope it is approved on August 26, 2024. With this in mind, the alternate Lucero Library service point at El Centro del Quinto Sol is expected to open sometime in September (not in August as originally planned.) The Lucero Library closes its operation at end of day on August 3, 2024. Construction is anticipated to start before mid-September.


