An anthology of more than 180 poets "whose poems bear witness to the beauty and power of this vital and expanding tradition: its profound engagement with pasts both mythical and historical, its reckoning with the complexities of language, land, and identity, and its vision of a nation enriched by the stories of immigrants, exiles, refugees, and their descendants."

Poet, author and editor of "Latino Poetry," Rigoberto González is the featured guest of the festival's annual luncheon. He will deliver his José Antonio Rodriguez Poet & author of "The Day's Hard Edge"

Banned Books Week is September 22-28

Banned Books Week was launched in 1982 in response to a sudden surge in the number of challenges to books in libraries, bookstores, and schools. By focusing on efforts to remove or restrict access to books, Banned Books Week draws national attention to the harms of censorship. The annual event highlights the value of free and open access to information and brings together the entire book community — librarians, educators, authors, publishers, booksellers and readers of all types — in shared support of the freedom to seek and to express ideas.

American Library Association's Office for Intellectual Freedom documented 1,247 demands to censor library books and resources in 2023. The number of titles targeted for censorship surged 65 percent in 2023 compared to 2022, reaching the highest levels ever documented by OIF in more than 20 years of tracking: 4,240 unique book titles were targeted for removal from schools and libraries. This tops the previous high from 2022, when 2,571 unique titles were targeted for censorship. Titles representing the voices and lived experiences of LGBTQIA+ and BIPOC individuals made up 47 percent of those targeted in censorship attempts.

Barkman Library completed a \$4.2 million facelift that included major improvements of an expanded community meeting room; a bridge connecting the library to an outdoor green space; dedicated spaces for children, teens and adults; and updated security systems.

Located at 1300 Jerry Murphy Rd., the 7,063 squarefoot branch has seen more than 1.6 million visitors come through its doors and more than 2.7 million materials have been checked out during the past 11 years.






