**Professor Says This System is  
Better Than "Lockstep Sys-  
tem" Now in Vogue**

San Francisco, Dec. 11.—Results of  
two years' experience with a system of  
"individual instruction" with five hun-  
dred pupils at the San Francisco state  
normal school, were announced today  
by Frederic Burk, president, in a mon-  
ograph advocating its substitution in  
public schools for the present class or  
"lockstep" system, upon which he laid  
the blame largely "for the army of  
life's misfits."
