CHARGES WITHDRAWN GROOM NOW WELCOME

Mrs. Mary E. Williams, mother of Irene Williams, the 13-year-old girl who Tuesday afternoon eloped and was married to Edward A. Griggs, aged 27 years, yesterday withdrew charges of kidnaping against the groom. Mrs. Williams is ready to give the couple if they will only turn to her home.

A warrant was sworn out for the arrest of Griggs, Wednesday afternoon, but the following day, the mother announced a willingness that the prosecution be dropped. The warrant was placed in the hands of a deputy sheriff who found that the couple had married the same afternoon the girl was secured. Search for the groom ceased at the request of the mother who yesterday morning withdrew charges.
