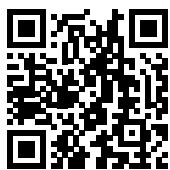
How to use the Seed Library:

You can dig it with the Tool Library

You can now check out tools to plant your Seed Library seeds!

Available Giodone and Rawlings libraries, borrow up to five items for seven days.

Available tools include:

- Cultivators
- Hand trowels
- Hoes
- Pruners
- Rakes

- Shovels
- A yard cart
- Goathead roller

You can place an item on hold and there are five check outs per person, no renewals. All tools must be cleaned of soil and debris. If an item is returned dirty, a \$5 fine will be charged. Patrons will be charged a replacement fee for lost or damaged items.

Items are available for check

out using a valid PCCLD library card.

All tools must be picked up from and returned to their home library. The Tool Library is a partnership between the Pueblo City-County Library District and the Pueblo Food Project. Patrons can request and take home garden tools. For more information please ask at your library's information desk.

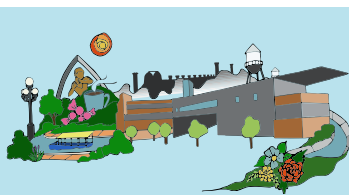
