












Patrick A. Lucero Library renovations near end

Renovations to the Patrick A. Lucero Library branch are nearing its completion, a week of festivities is planned starting September 29 with the official ribbon cutting on October 1.

Library services are still available at El Centro del Quinto Sol, 609 E 6th St. Patrons can still check out and pick up library materials, check out items from the popular Seed and Spice libraries.

Chess with Mark from Hard-Knox Gang Prevention & Intervention is still taking place Tuesdays and Thursdays. Other Lucero Library programs will take a break August and September to allow staff to prepare for the opening of the new and expanded library, located on Pueblo's East Side.

Lucero at El Centro's summer hours are noon to 7 p.m., Monday through Thursday, and noon to 6 p.m., Friday and Saturday.

The Patrick A. Lucero Library now features an expanded public meeting room and revamped front entrance that increases the branch's footprint to 10,000 square feet.

PCCLD launches Artist-In-Residence program

Pueblo City-County Library District launches Artist in Residence program at Rawlings Library.

Former Puebloan Kimberly Sewell is the program's first artist in residence. Her work will be on display in the Maker Space beginning August 1. Kimberley is a multidisciplinary artist and educator currently located in Albuquerque, N.M. She is primarily a fiber artist and printmaker whose work explores the varying ways these mediums can be combined.

Artists chosen for the program are provided with dedicated time, space, and resources to focus on their creative work while engaging with a specific community, organization, or institution. The program typically allows artists to explore new ideas, experiment with their craft, and produce original artwork, often inspired by the local culture, history, or resources of the host institution.

In addition to displaying her work, Kimberley will also host open hours as well as artist workshops including cyanotype and block printing, blackout poetry, and more.

Kim holds an MFA in creative writing from Regis University and has shown work across Southern Colorado and throughout New Mexico, where she lives with her husband and their clowder of cats.
