The funeral of Miss Charlotte Lewis

Thomas H. Gardner, aged 74 years,  
died at the family residence, 1225  
Beulah avenue, last evening. In the  
death of Tom Gardner is additional  
proof that the "G" pioneers of the  
steel works are fast going to the great  
beyond. Born in Troy, New York, he  
spent his early youth in the nail  
factories of his native city. He was one  
of the first to answer President Lin-  
coln's call for troops at the commence-  
ment of the rebellion. He served in  
the Army of the Potomac, and was  
mustered out on the twenty-ninth of  
April, 1865, with the rank of Lieutenant.  
At the battle of Cold Harbor he  
was severely wounded, but recovered  
and went back to the front. In 1863 he  
came to Bessemer and has resided here  
continuously. The funeral will be held  
at the residence Saturday afternoon  
at 2:30 o'clock. Interment at Mountain-  
view in charge of the Whiton Mortu-  
ary association.
