

JOHN GILLIGAN.

In the death of John Gilligan, which occurred Saturday night at the home of his mother at D and Lamkin streets, Pueblo loses one of her oldest residents.

For some months Mr. Galligan had spent most of his time in Cripple Creek where he was interested in one of the most promising properties. There he he was taken sick about two weeks ago and was brought home. He suffered from the results of a severe attack of the grip but the immediate cause of his death was heart failure.

Mr. Gilligan was born in Boston 49 years ago and lived there until he was 8 or 9 years old when the family home was removed to Davenport, Iowa, where he enlisted in company I, Sixteenth Iowa volunteers, and served until the end of the war. For a short time afterwards he lived in Omaha. In 1869 he came to Pueblo and has made his home here ever since. He was a shoemaker by trade and opened the first shoe store in the city. In this and other ventures he was successful and amassed two fortunes which later unfortunate investments destroyed.

Funeral services will be held at St. Ignatius' church this morning at 9:30 o'clock. Funeral procession will start from his mother's house at 9 o'clock, the body being escorted by the G. A. R. post of which he was a member. Friends of the family invited to attend.
