Black History Live: giving voice to the past

Celebrating Black History Month, PCCLD partnered with Colorado Humanities to bring two living-history performances, also known as Chautauquas, of Mary Fields "Stagecoach Mary," the first Black woman carrier with a star-route mail in U.S. history, and York, an enslaved man who was the only African American on the Lewis and Clark expedition.



"The Black History Live Chautauquas are more than entertainment; they are an act of reclaiming lost narratives," Amanda Dalie, program and events manager with PCCLD said.

"By humanizing historical icons like York and Mary Fields, we bridge the gap between our past and our present, ensuring these essential voices are never silenced again," she added.



“Americans and the Holocaust: A Traveling Exhibition for Libraries” is an educational initiative of the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum and the American Library Association. The traveling exhibition began by touring to 50 U.S. libraries from 2021 to 2023; due to widespread interest from libraries and communities around the country, a second tour was developed for 2024 to 2026.





Project timeline is 2026

- **Access impacts:** Public elevator availability will be phased to keep at least one public elevator accessible when possible; there may be periods when both are offline for testing and on-




going work. If both elevators are unavailable, PCCLD will plan alternative routes for patrons with accessibility needs.

- **Interim measures:** Clear signage directing patrons to alternate routes and staff and security support for building access.

- We are committed to keeping staff and the public informed and to minimizing disruption. If you have mobility, access, or service needs, please contact library staff so we can arrange
