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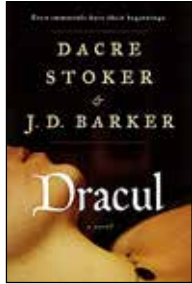

A bloody good All Pueblo Reads



Bat away the heat and sink your teeth into this year's All Pueblo Reads! From a Dracula prequel to the science of blood to a monster-hunting pig, here are the authors of the 22nd annual All Pueblo Reads literacy project:



Dacre Stoker "Dracul"

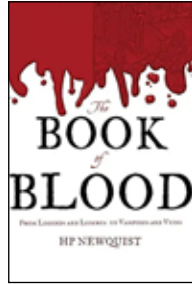
A moody, Gothic thriller taking place in 1868, 21-year-old Bram Stoker locks himself inside an abbey's tower to face off against a nightmarish beast.

Armed with mirrors, crucifixes, holy water and a gun, Stoker attempts to survive the longest night of his life.



Written by Dacre Stoker, the great grand-nephew of Bram Stoker, in collaboration with J.D. Barker, "Dracul" is a stand-alone prequel to Bram's classic "Dracula" and is based upon the previously unpublished journal of Bram Stoker.

The journal and its more than 100-year-old collection of papers was recently published as "The Lost Journal of Bram Stoker: The Dublin Years," a collaboration between Dacre Stoker and Dr. Elizabeth Miller.



HP Newquist "The Book Of Blood: From Legends And Leeches To Vampires And Veins"

A non-fiction selection for young adults examines blood's myths, legends and the science of life's sticky most vital fluid.



Readers will meet the doctors and scientists who have tried to unravel the secrets of blood for centuries, beasts who need to drink blood to live, the amazing things that blood does as it pulses along thousands of miles of vessels and a few mythological creatures that might not be so mythical after all.

HP Newquist is the author of more than a dozen books, hundreds of magazine articles, and several filmed documentaries. His work has appeared in such diverse publications as "The New York Times", "Newsweek", "Billboard" "Forbes" "Rolling Stone" and more.



Rich Moyer "Ham Helsing: Vampire Hunter"

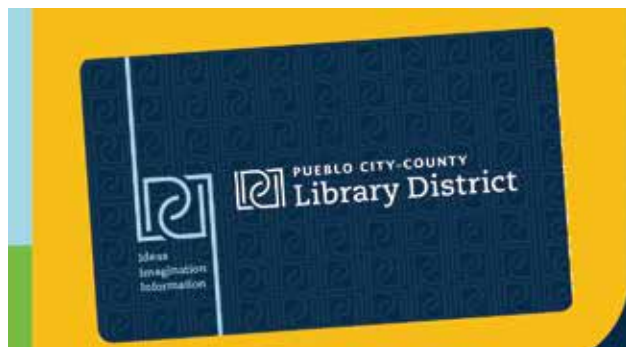

“Shark Summer” shines for Read Out Loud

PCCLD hosted youth author and illustrator Ira Marcks for Read Out Loud.

Marcks discussed his process for creating a story from idea to drawing the characters and background scenes during his in-person presentation on April 2.

More than 300 area students attended his live presentation at Hoag Theater at Pueblo Community College with almost 200 viewing the graphic novel-themed presentation online.

More than 300 copies of his book “Shark Summer” were

give out to attendees to the live presentation. “Shark Summer” is about blockbuster movies, secret histories and evil sharks.

Marcks is an award-winning, “New York Times”-recommended artist and educator. His work explores the potential of cartoon narratives and has led an eclectic mix of collaborators including the Hugo Award-winning magazine, *Weird Tales*, the European Research Council, and a White House Fellowship Researcher.

Spring is in full bloom at Pueblo City-County Library District as April brought a chance to build community through plant swaps, a chess tournament, contest celebrations and more.

Dr. Seuss Character Contest

To kick off the month, creativity was celebrated by awarding the Dr. Seuss Character Contest on April 2. Participants, grades pre-K through 12, had the challenge of creating Dr. Seuss characters and writing a brief description of them. There were a total of 679 entries and 38 winners.

Plant Swaps

What's a plant swap but a great way to build communities? PCCLD held three plant swaps at Barkman, Giodone and Pueblo West branches. Participants came with their plants to share clippings and expand collection of house plants with clippings from their friends and neighbors.

Hardknox Chess Tournament

Chess is a game of strategy and respect and the crew at Kardknox Gang Prevention and Intervention is doing the work in the community to understand youth and adults' perception of the world that surrounds them. More than a dozen youth participants gathered for a chess tournament on April 17 at the Patrick A. Lucero branch.

Hardknox Gang Prevention and Intervention has the goal to promote positive change internally and mentally. Through the game of chess, they're able to teach how to create a cost vs. benefit analysis when it comes to decision making. Participants learn to avoid impulsive decisions by considering their next moves and the consequences or rewards waiting on the other side of that decision.

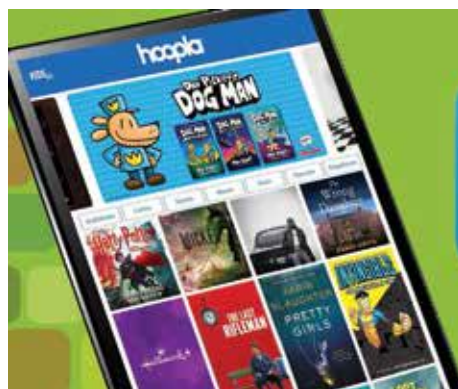

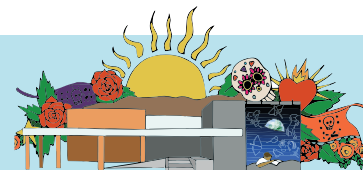

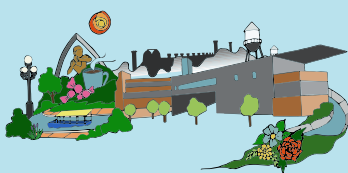
