

WITH FELONIOUS INTENT.

So Says the Coroner's Jury in the Leach Killing.

Soon after 6 o'clock last evening the coroner's jury in the case of John H. Leach, who was killed last Thursday morning by Deputy United States Marshal R. E. Taylor, brought in a verdict reciting that "deceased came to his death by a gunshot wound in the head on the morning of the 5th day of July, 1894, at Stumpf's saloon on Union avenue, inflicted by one R. E. Taylor with felonious intent." The verdict is signed by Thomas J. Hockett, N. R. Hanlon, J. G. Cozad, Charles Biernbaum, John Morse and George Larson.

James Lowe, H. F. Guyson, Thomas J. Conibear and Fred Huth, deputies, testified that Leach had a gun and was pointing it at Taylor who told him twice to put it up before he was shot. Dr. J. J. Willard testified to the position of the wounded man on the floor and the nature of his injuries. George Stumpf established the ownership of the saloon, of the gun found near Leach, etc.
