### Entrance:

Use the east side of the school from the parking lot off Colgate Lane.

### Services That May Be Available may include:

- Victim assistance
- Food and basic needs support
- Public health support
- Behavioral health support
- Department of Human Services support
- Red Cross support
- Agriculture support
- Private insurance assistance
- Community resource navigation

You must bring proof of residency to enter the Disaster Assistance Center.

### Proof of residency may include:

- Photo ID with your address
- Mail showing your address
- Another official document showing where you live

*Important: Hours may change. Confirm current hours before going.*
