Summer Reading is slowly winding down, but you can help us finish strong! As of July 21, more than 10,000 Summer Reading game boards have been turned, and hundreds of prizes have been earned.

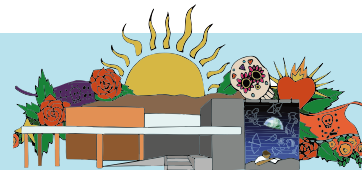

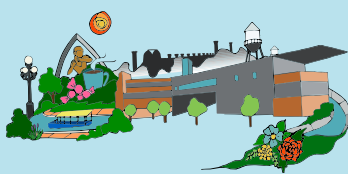

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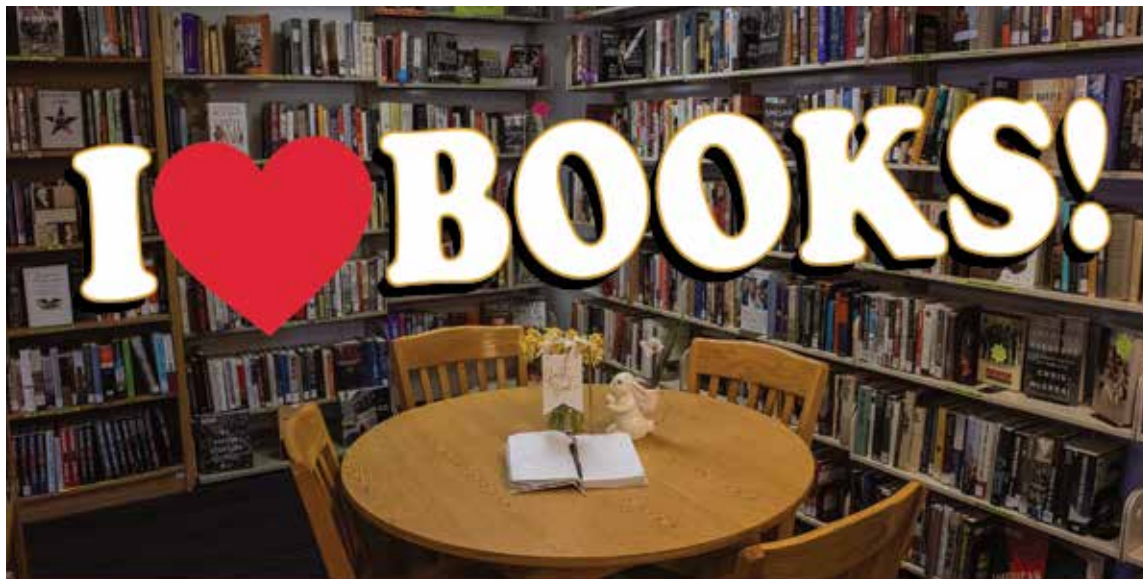
