

Library ConnectED

The Pueblo City-County Library District, Pueblo City Schools, and Pueblo County School District 70 are collaborating on the White House's national initiative called The Library ConnectED Challenge (<https://www.imls.gov/issues/national-initiatives/connected-library-challenge>). Pueblo is one of more than 30 major cities and counties taking the challenge, which includes a commitment to support student learning through programming that develops their language, reading, and critical thinking; provides digital resources, such as E-books and online collections of traditional media; and provides broadband connectivity and wireless access within library facilities. The goal is to improve student access to learning resources and books in America's libraries. This initiative includes the support of the White House, the Institute of Museum and Library Services, the American Library Association and the Urban Libraries Council.

To fulfill this partnership, PCCLD is providing every Pueblo City Schools and District 70 student with a public library account using each student's school identification numbers instead of separate library cards.

With their Library ConnectED account, students can:

- Access library research databases

- Borrow e-materials

Includes downloadable books, audiobooks, music and videos

- Borrow up to five each: books, books on CD, playaways, playaway book packs, magazines (except current issues), puppets; for 21 days

- Borrow one each: DVD, CD, video game, playaway view, playaway launchpad; for seven days.

NOTE: There are no overdue fines for ConnectED accounts, but users are responsible for fees on lost or damaged books.

To access online information and checkout materials the student must know their student ID and birthdate. Their student ID is their library card number. Their birthdate in the following format: mmddyyyy; is their PIN.

Right now, the ConnectED Program is limited to Pueblo City Schools and D70; we offer library visits, <http://www.pueblolibrary.org/booklibraryvisit>, to other schools to provide a library card drive and information about other library services.

Other ways PCCLD supports students and educators

PCCLD provides a variety of other services that can support student success throughout the year.

Organizational library cards

An organization card is issued to an institution, company, center, establishment or association that is either profit or non-profit, and has more than five employees, members, partners or associates. Possible eligible institutions include public schools, daycare centers, nursing homes, hospitals, etc.

The organization must be a legal entity within the boundaries of Pueblo City-County Library District. Local clubs or social groups are not eligible for this card.

Organization cards expire after one year, and upon expiration an updated application must be submitted. See any library staff member for an application.
