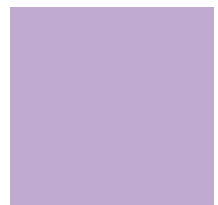
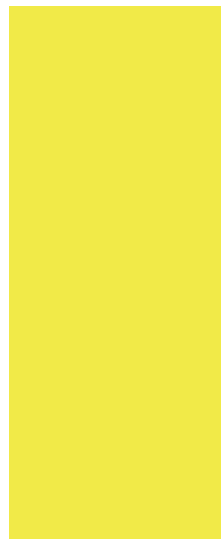

★ LAUNCHED LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

Pueblo City-County Library District held its inaugural Leadership Institute for girls in grades 10-12. The program, which ran from February through July, taught young women how to be leaders, create positive change in the community, speak in public and develop a plan for life after high school. The six-month long institute culminated with Le Bal de Bibliotheque, where each of the 10 women were recognized by their parents and the community for their work. The program resulted in life-long friendships, future female leaders and financial support for the Pueblo Library Foundation.

★ ConnectED

ConnectEd is an Obama administration program with the goal of improving student access to the learning resources and books of America's libraries. This initiative includes the support of the White House, the Institute of Museum and Library Services, the American Library Association and the Urban Libraries Council. The program was implemented in partnership with PCCLD, Pueblo City Schools and Pueblo District 70, and every student now has a public library account using their student ID. Pueblo is one of more than 30 major cities and counties committing to support student learning through programming that develops their language, reading and critical thinking; provide digital resources; and provide broadband connectivity and wireless access within library facilities. With their library ConnectEd account, studens can access library research databases, borrow e-materials, audiobooks, music, movies, books, magazines, etc. There are no overdue fees, but users are responsible for fees on lost or damaged materials.

★ TWO NEW LIBRARY LOCATIONS

Following the addition of three new libraries in 2015, PCCLD established two more libraries in partnership with educational institutions CSU-Pueblo and Pueblo Community College. Library at the U at CSU-Pueblo and the Library at Pueblo Community College will allow PCCLD to extend its services and increase accessibility to educators and students.

ALL PUEBLO READS

The 11th Annual All Pueblo Reads was a record breaker! This year's project featured *Water for Elephants* by Sara Gruen. The companion book for young readers was *Out of the Dust* by Karen Hesse. 170 events and activities were held with 18 community partners. All programs, events and activities tied in with circus, the 1930s, The Great Depression, animals and other book themes. To expand last year's efforts to increase reading among young readers, more than 1,200 free copies of *Out of the Dust* were given to local students. More than 650 attended three presentations by Karen Hesse. The Booklovers Blacktie Ball was also the second most successful yet, with 217 in attendance and \$33,700 in funds raised. Total participation for All Pueblo Reads was 40,365.

SUMMER READING CLUB

PCCLD's award-winning Summer Reading Program was also record-breaking, with a total of 35,297 people participating. Designed to keep everyone reading during the summer, the program was held June through August and featured the theme On Your Mark, Get Set, Read! The program focused on sports and exercise and included more than 100 activities held at all library locations and partnering venues. As part of this year's theme, the InfoZone Museum featured the exhibit Eat Well, Play Well from the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry and the National Institute for Health. Summer activities kicked-off in June with an outdoor concert, face painting and a magic show.

READ OUT LOUD!

Tony Abbott, author of more than 100 books for young readers, visited Pueblo for the 7th annual Read Out Loud! program. Twenty-two schools in both local school districts participated by reading Abbott's *The Hidden Stairs* and *The Magic Carpet*. This book is the first in the popular *Secrets of Droons* series. A total of 3,629 people participated in programming over the course of the project, which culminated in Abbott's two-day visit, April 20-21.

GENERAL★FUND

Revenue & Expenditures

Note 1: Revenues and Expenditures are reported for each of the governmental fund types. Fund-based financial data is focused on reporting current financial resources. These are resources that are generally available for and spent on current year activities. The Library District maintains a General Fund for operational revenues and expenditures and a Capital Projects Fund for facilities, improvements and expansion.

Note 2: The Statement of Net Assets reports current and long-term financial resources of the Library District as a whole, representing the Library District's Balance Sheet for primary government activities. Net assets invested in capital assets represent the net book value of facilities, furniture, equipment, computers, vehicles, software, books and audiovisual materials. Restricted net assets represent emergency reserve requirements. Unrestricted net assets represent cash and other net assets available for operational expenses and capital improvements. Amounts reported are net of applicable debt.

Note 3: GASB Statement No. 68 has been implemented effective Jan. 1, 2016. As of Dec. 31, 2015 the library's proportionate share of Net Pension Liability was \$7,259,931. This amount is included in unrestricted net assets. Financial information in this report is derived from the Library District's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR). The Library District prepares its financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). However, GAAP requires certain financial presentation and disclosures that are not included in this report. Conforming reports are presented in the CAFR and include a greater amount of financial detail, individual fund statements, and budget data.

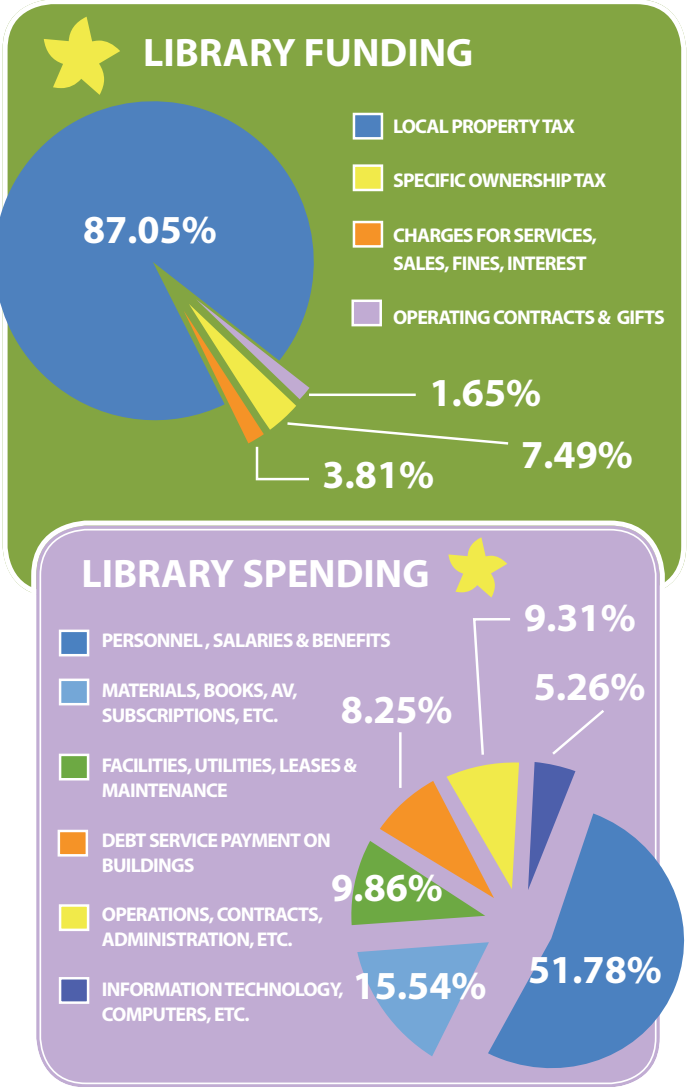

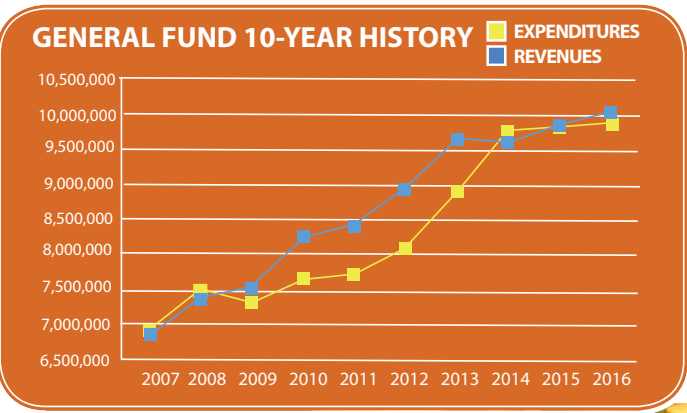

2016 HIGHLIGHTS

★ PRESTIGIOUS STAR LIBRARY AWARD

PCCLD received the prestigious Star Library Award from the *Library Journal*, the oldest and most respected professional library publication. The recognition places PCCLD among the top three percent of libraries in the nation. It also affirms the staff's dedication to planning, accountability, services and strong community support. The LJ Index of Public Library Service reviews data on 7,500 libraries across the country and narrows their selection down to the top libraries that are delivering exceptional service. America's Star Libraries offers an overall indication of how a library's performance stacks up to peer libraries, taking into account such measures as computer usage, circulation, program attendance and library visits.

★ SMITHSONIAN HUMAN ORIGIN EXHIBIT

PCCLD was one of 19 libraries to host "Exploring Human Origins: What Does It Mean to Be Human?," a national traveling exhibition based on the Smithsonian's "What Does It Mean to Be Human?" permanent exhibition at the National Museum of Natural History. The traveling exhibition was on display March 28 through April 23 at the InfoZone Museum. The exhibit was accompanied by several community discussions that included a conversation about how human origins relate to people's understanding of the world and their place in it. The talks were presented by Dr. Connie Bertka, Dr. Jim Miller, Dr. Briana Pobiner and Dr. Rick Potts.

★ SPELL GRANT RECIPIENT

PCCLD received the SPELL Grant (Supporting Parents in Early Literacy). The program provides tips and tools for early literacy programming, targeting families in low-income communities with kids ages birth-3 years old. Pueblo was one of eight Colorado libraries to introduce the grant. Programming for Pueblo included partnerships with the Thatcher Learning Center, Trinity Lutheran Early Learning Center, Kinderkirk Preschool and Benjamin Franklin Elementary School. Library staff visited the four schools weekly and distributed literacy kits to educators and families. Staff also used this time to model storytime, introduce literacy activities and games, and develop relationships with parents and preschool students, encouraging families to regularly participate in early literacy programming at their local library.

The Center works to promote and enhance personal success through expanded educational and cultural opportunities not just for the Hispanic community but for the Pueblo community at large.



The purpose of the Friends of the Pueblo City-County Library District is to help the library system make educational, informational, cultural and recreational services available to the public. The Friends have existed for 57 years, and have given more than \$984,000 to the library during that time. Accomplishments for 2016-17 year are listed below:

THANKS TO OUR FRIENDS MEMBERS

EDUCATIONAL & RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES

- Judged 1,801 entries in the Scary Story Contest. The winners received a booklet of the winning stories, a gift certificate to Books Again and a Folkmanis puppet.
- Sponsored the Friends of the Library Youth Creative Writing Contest with 107 entries, and provided Books Again gift certificates to winners.
- Helped sponsor the annual Pueblo Girl Essay Contest for girls in grades 3-5. Each grade winner received an American Girl doll and book, and all runners-up received an American Girl book.
- Sponsored the Create Your Own Dr. Seuss Character Contest by providing Books Again gift certificates and refreshments at the awards ceremony. Winners also received a booklet of the winning entries and a Dr. Seuss prize package. This was the second highest year for entries as 2,100 figments of students' imaginations were received!
- Presented Books Again gift certificates to Poetry Winners.
- Donated \$6,500 to Pueblo City-County Library District's Summer Reading program.
- Donated \$5,000 to the READ Out Loud! program.
- Donated \$11,000 to All Pueblo Reads program.

INTERNATIONAL & CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

- The Project Selection Committee awarded \$31,985.93 to fulfill 24 grant requests from library employees.
- Provided \$3,000 toward the printing and postage of *News & Events*. The newsletter is an important communications tool for informing the community about library activities.
