


THE PROJECT

About the book

The Things They Carried is a fictionalized account of a U.S. Army platoon fighting on the ground during the Vietnam War. The collection of linked short stories is based on O'Brien's own combat experience during the war. The Things They Carried was a finalist for both the Pulitzer Prize and the National Book Critics Circle Award. This year marks the 30th anniversary of the book's publishing.

About Tim O'Brien

He was born in 1946 in Austin, Minn., and spent most of his youth in the small town of Worthington, Minn. He graduated summa cum laude from Macalester College in 1968. From February 1969 to March 1970 he served as infantryman with the U.S. Army in Vietnam.

After his discharge from the army, O'Brien pursued graduate studies at Harvard University. He worked as a national affairs reporter for The Washington Post from 1973 to 1974.

O'Brien currently is professor of creative writing at Texas State University.



ABOUT THIS YEAR'S PROJECT

As with most events this year, the NEA Big Read All Pueblo Reads will look different from years past. This year, the library is focusing on developing online learning modules for students from elementary school through adult, and pairing learning opportunities with virtual author visits, and library and community programming. On October 14 and 15, author Jim O'Conner will present to students in Pueblo School District 60 and Pueblo County School District 70 about his book *What Was The Vietnam War?* On November 5 and 6, Tim O'Brien, author of *The Things They Carried*, will present to CSU-Pueblo and Pueblo Community College students and the greater Pueblo community. Tim O'Brien will also be the guest speaker at the virtual Booklovers Ball, a fundraiser supporting the Pueblo Library Foundation.

Col. (ret) Charles Bogel: A Pilots Perspective

Thursday, Oct. 1, 6 p.m.

Charles Bogel amassed 841 hours of combat flying as a helicopter gunship pilot in Vietnam. For his actions he was awarded the Air Medal with 31 clusters and a V for valor. He also received the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Bogel will recount his experience of piloting a gunship in combat, the actions in which he received recognition, and his life of service following the War.

Lt. Col. (ret) Mary Littlejohn: A Nurses Perspective

Mary Littlejohn served in the Air Force Nurse Corps from 1967-87. Among her assignments, she served as a Flight Nurse on C-130 aircraft in Vietnam from 1970-71.

Tom Tudor: Guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier

After being drafted at 18 years old, Tom volunteered to serve as a Sentinel at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Tom served as Sentinel, then as Relief Commander at the Tomb from 1969-70.

Tom will talk about the honor of being a Sentinel and will guide the audience through the symbolic "Walking the Mat" and "Changing of the Guard".

Bob Begel: A Combat Corpsman/ Medics Perspective

Bob Begel was 19 years old when he was in Vietnam serving as Fleet Marine Force Corpsman, providing direct medical support to Marines in combat from 1969-1970. Among his many awards for service during the War, Bob received the Purple Heart.

Bob will tell his story of being a young medic doing everything in his power to save lives in the mist of heavy combat.


