



Adult Summer Reading 2015

The 2015 Adult Summer Reading project, Escape the Ordinary, took place from June 1-Aug. 15 and offered 162 programs to the community. Total adult registrations increased by 305% from 2014 (500). Pueblo West library had 413 registrations,



an increase of 987% over 2014 (38). Library @ the Y, Barkman, Lamb and Rawlings all had three-digit percentage-increases in registrations while Avondale satellite increased by 50%.

Lucero, Greenhorn Valley and Giodone libraries participated for the first time this year. Lucero registered 258 adults, which was the highest among Giodone (166) and Greenhorn Valley (125).

Program attendance totaled 3,020. This is a 174% increase from 2014 (1,103).

There was a registration incentive program for library staff. A pizza party was awarded to the library with the highest percentage-increase over 2014 and to one of the new libraries with the highest total of registrations.
