#### AMENDMENT VIII

#### Letter Agreement for Courier Service

Pueblo City-County Library District (District)

and

R&S Delivery Servicer (Contractor)

- 1. This document amends the Courier Service Agreement signed by Randy Medina September 26, 2008 and signed by PCCLD on September 29, 2008 which is incorporated by this reference.
- 2. All terms, conditions and provisions remain the same as in the original agreement referenced in 1 above, except:
  - 1. **TERM:** January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017.
  - 2. **INSURANCE:** Contractor represents it has, or is not required to have Workers' Compensation Insurance because the appropriate waivers have been filed. Contractor will have Public Liability, Property Damage and Automobile Liability Insurance with policy limits of \$ 1,000,000 (one million dollars) per person and \$ 1,000,000 (one million dollars) per incident and will provide PCCLD with evidence of said coverage within 30 days of the execution of this agreement.
  - 3. **SCOPE OF WORK:** See attached Courier Flow document.
  - 4. **FEES:** The weekly fee for performance of service is \$1,105.00 per week, beginning January 1, 2017, then effective for the remainder of the contract year 2017.

Except as specifically amended herein, the agreement entered into in September 2008 set forth in the first paragraph above remains in full force and effect.

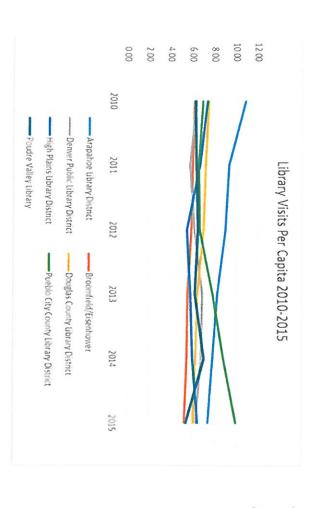

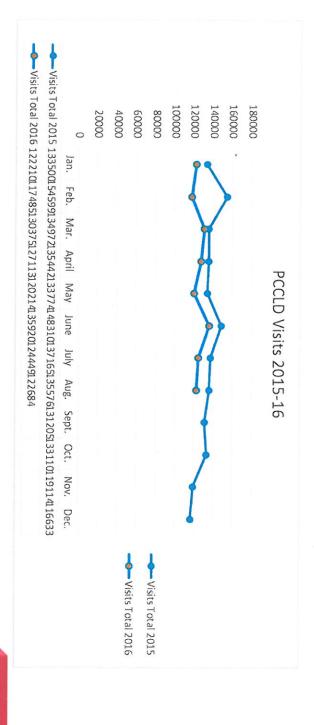

# Visits per Capita - Peer Comparison

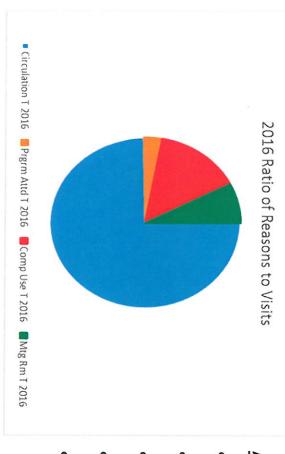

# Impact of Circulations to Visits

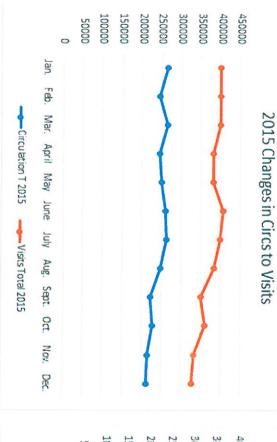


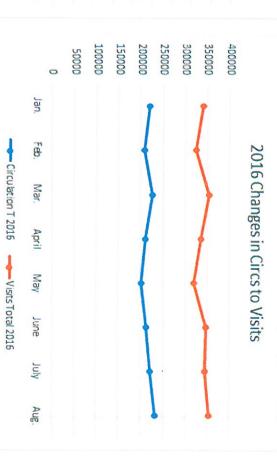

# Circulation- Background in 2014

- DVD circulations account for 65% of district's total circulation.
- demand checkouts In spring of 2014 we changed circulation policies to allow 15 DVD checkouts per customer. This was an increase from 5 high demand and 5 non high
- At the same time we began auto renewing items one time if there is no hold.
- existing 5 locations Collection Development spent an all time high of \$500,000 on media items for
- An additional \$300,000 was spent on media to open the three new libraries.

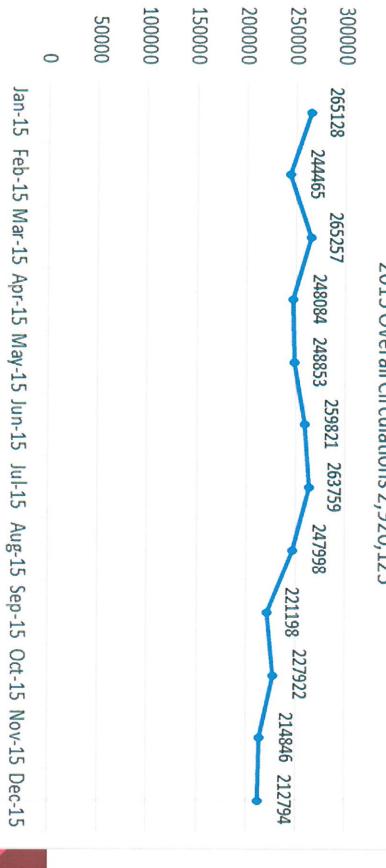
## Circulation-2015

\$800,000 spent on media in 2014 sustained high circs through mid 2015.

Media budget for 2015 was reduced to \$450,000 to be spread through 8 locations.

Fewer copies of high demand titles were purchased which had a large impact on circulation.

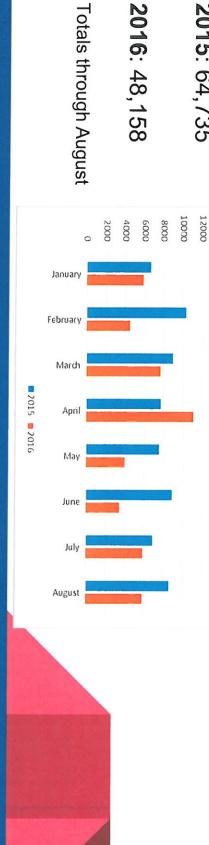
