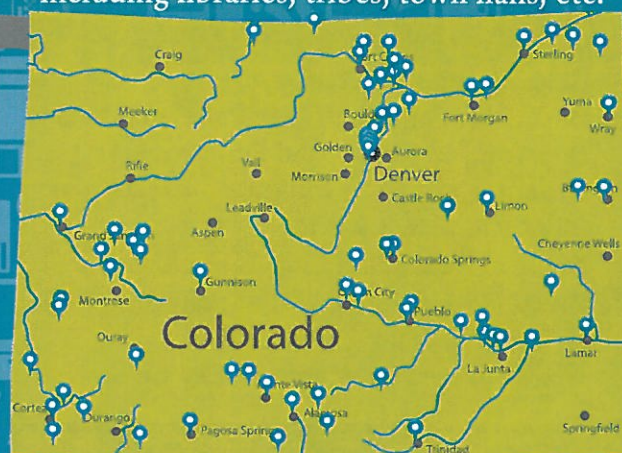

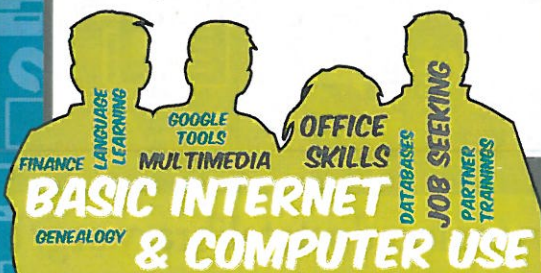

All the computer classes have come in so handy. They all have been helping me get a job.

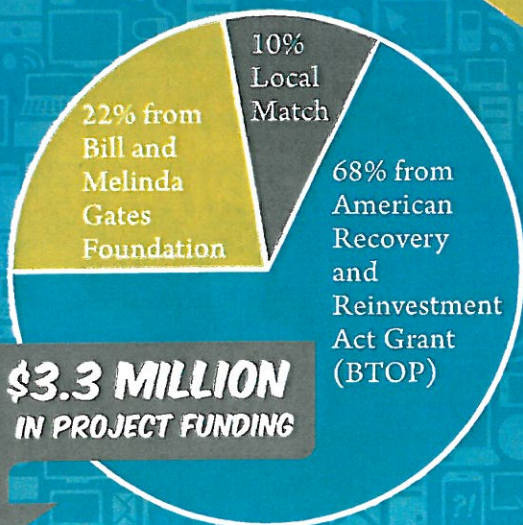
