What is the Digital Memory Lab?

- •One of 7 libraries in U.S. to receive grant

What is the Digital Memory Lab?

- · A DIY place for personal digital archiving
- We provide equipment for digitizing personal archival collections
- The lab can be reserved for 3 hour sessions; transfer happens in real time
- •The memory lab is NOT a digitization "service"
- Free of charge
- · Lab opens in September
- Orientations will be held several times per month and are required to make reservations in the Memory Lab

What Can I Digitize at the Memory Lab?

- Documents
- Photographs
- Negatives
- Slides
- Cassettes and VHS Tapes
- Possibly More

What Can I Not Digitize at the Memory Lab?

- •Open Reel Film (e.g. super 8)
- •8" Floppy Disks
- Other Obscure Media Formats
- Moldy or Disintegrating Material
